# PANNA FROST FLOWER LACE SHAWL

HANDKNIT VERSION

## **Yarn**

any fingering – lace weight, 2 ply: 750m  
(on the picture: Barka Vattacukor 20%  
silk, 80% super kid mohair, 214m / 25g)

## **Finished measurement**

46cm x 150cm (18" x 59")

## **Needles**

3.5 mm (US 4)

## **Tools**

Tapestry needle, T-pins, blocking wire  
(optional)

## **Construction note**

The scarf is consist of two identical  
halves grafted together.



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## **Cast on**

Cast on 106 stitches with long tail (continental) method.

### **I. section: Scalloped border**

Continue to work chart – section I.

### **II. section: Frost flower pattern panel**

Continue to work chart – section II.

### **III. section: Faggot pattern panel**

Continue to work chart – section III.

### **IV. section: Simple stocking stitch panel**

50 rows simple stocking stitch. (Or more if you want a longer scarf.)

## Bind off

Change to waste yarn. Knit 10-15 rows. Cast off.

## Finishing

Graft together the two parts. Unravel the waste yarn.

A proper lace-blocking is necessary for the perfect look of your shawl.

Soak finished item in cold water with gentle soap or wool wash. Leave it for 10-15 minutes. Drain water and squeeze out excess moisture from the item (be careful not to wring or twist the fabric). Roll into a large dry towel and squeeze to force out as much water as possible.

Use blocking wires and T-pins for best results. Stretch the scarf to your preferred dimensions and pin out. Leave it to dry at least for 24 hours.
