- 2x 12mm half pearls, 2x 8mm half pearls, 2x 6mm half pearls

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General explanation

All three mushrooms consist of the fungal stipe (stem), inner cap and outer cap (pileus) and the individual facial features. All these individual parts must be crocheted separately. Each body part will be crocheted with the C hook size 2 using yarn for hook size 2,5 - 3,5.

Be aware of the color change and filling instructions in the further description!

Mushroom No. 1 (large)

<u>1. Fungal stipe (stem)</u>

The bottom of the stipe is crocheted with "marone" (chestnut) yarn using the C hook size 2. Once finished crocheting the bottom, it needs to be stuffed with granules.


Afterwards you have to change the color of the yarn to "cream" for crocheting the stem in spiral rounds.



the large mushroom

a) Bottom (color of the yarn: marone/ chestnut)

The bottom is crocheted with "marone" yarn using the C hook size 2. Once finished crocheting the bottom, it needs to be stuffed with fiberfill or granules.


 \rightarrow **<u>important</u>**: when the first bottom is finished – fasten off the last stitch; and weave in yarn invisibly

 \rightarrow 2nd bottom: don't fasten off the last stitch – place the first bottom on the second bottom and join them by crocheting 45 sc; fill the hollow space with granules or fiberfill and finally close the round with 9 sc – compare the following pictures on the next page for further details



b) Stipe (color of the yarn: cream)



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



2. Eyes (make 2)

The eyes are crocheted using white yarn (hook size 2.5 - 3.5 (e.g. "Catania") as well as your C hook size 2. Furthermore the eyes will not be stuffed and subsequently they are sewn onto the head (cf. fig.)






 \rightarrow fasten off the last sc afterwards; cut yarn with scissors, leave a tail of about 10 inches (which you'll need to sew the eyes onto the head in the next step)

 \rightarrow afterwards you have to crochet the templates of the eyes

3. templates of the eyes (make 2)

The templates of the eyes are crocheted using yarn (hook size 2.5 - 3.5 (e.g. "Catania") as well as your C hook size 2.

color of the yarn: linen



 \rightarrow finish last stitch, close the round and tie in ends; weave in ends invisibly; the templates will be sewn onto the stem with sewing thread

Step in between – Finalising the eye area


 \rightarrow the eyes will be pinned in the right place onto the templates

 \rightarrow after that the finished eye area will be sewn onto the stem with sewing yarn (see pictures)



4. Nose

The nose of the big mushroom will be made using needle size B and yarn for needle size C-D(E) (yarn color is orchid). During crocheting the nose will be firmly stuffed with fiberfill.



 \rightarrow finish last stitch, close the round and tie in ends; weave in ends invisibly

 \rightarrow sew the nose onto the stem between the eyes with sewing yarn – compare the pictures

5. cap (pileus)

The cap consists of the outer cap, the inner cap and the dots. All these individual parts must be crocheted separately. Each part of the cap will be crocheted with the C hook size 2 using yarn for hook size 2,5-3,5.

After completion the inner cap will be joined with sc to the outer cap. The finished cap will be sewn onto the stem.

Procedure crocheting for each part of the cap:

continuously crocheting in spiral rounds


The inner cap is crocheted with "mimosa" yarn using the C hook size 2. Once finished crocheting the inner cap, it doesn't need to be stuffed with fiberfill.



b) outer cap

The outer cap is crocheted with "red" yarn using the C hook size 2. Once finished crocheting the outer cap it doesn't need to be stuffed with fiberfill.




 \rightarrow don't finish the last stitch, you will need it later on (see picture) – compare the next step

 \rightarrow important: before you can join the inner cap and outer cap it is recommended to crochet the dots first.

<u>c) dots</u>

The dots are crocheted with "white" yarn using the C hook size 2. Afterwards they will be sewn onto the red outer cap.

The number of the dots can be self-determined. The following guidelines therefore serve only as a guide. Compare the pictures below:



Procedure crocheting for each dot:

d) Step in between – Finalising the cap

 \rightarrow turn the inner cap inside out and put it into the outer cap

 \rightarrow the remaining loops from round 16 (inner cap) and round 20 (outer cap) must sit opposite each other; sew the loops with needle and yarn together - cf. fig. below




 \rightarrow to make the completed cap, you will have to take up the "unfinished" stitch at the outer cap and crochet further:

→ important: while crocheting in both loops of the outer cap, you will have to crochet in the front loops of the inner cap only - cf. fig.
close up of round 1: crocheting in both loops (outer cap) and crochting in front loops only (inner cap)



→ don't fasten off the last stitch; fold the last round (round 8) to the visible sc of the inner cap (last round of the inner cap) and join them with $\underline{132 \ sc}$ – compare the following pictures for further details:

close up of round 8




 \rightarrow the finished cap should look like this:



6. final work

- \rightarrow now: sew the finished cap slightly oblique onto the stem using sewing thread
- \rightarrow create the pupils with 2 half pearls (12mm) : cf. fig.





 \rightarrow 2nd bottom: don't fasten off the last stitch – place the first bottom on the second bottom and join them by crocheting 24 sc; fill the hollow space with granules or fiberfill and finally close the round with 6 sc – compare the following pictures for further details







The templates of the eyes are crocheted using yarn (hook size 2.5 - 3.5 (e.g. "Catania") as well as your C hook size 2.

color of the yarn: linen




 \rightarrow finish last stitch, close the round and tie in ends; weave in ends invisibly; the templates will be sewn onto the stem with sewing thread

<u>Step in between – Finalising the eye area</u>

 \rightarrow the eyes will be pinned in the right place onto the templates

 \rightarrow after that the finished eye area will be sewn onto the stem with sewing yarn (see pictures)



4. nose

The nose of the medium mushroom will be made using needle size B and yarn for needle size C-D(E) (yarn color orchid). During crocheting the nose will be stuffed with fiberfill firmly.







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Mushroom No. 3 (small)

<u>1. Fungal stipe (stem)</u>

The stipe is crocheted with "marone" yarn using the C hook size 2 at first.

Afterwards you have the change the color of the yarn to "cream" for crocheting the stem in spiral rounds. The stem is filled with granules and with fiberfill.

The inner cap is crocheted with "mimosa" yarn using the C hook size 2. Once finished crocheting the inner cap, it doesn't need to be stuffed with fiberfill.



The dots are crocheted with "white" yarn using the C hook size 2. Afterwards they will be sewn onto the red outer cap.

The number of the dots can be self-determined. The following guidelines therefore serve only as a guide. Compare the pictures below:

I) dot (make 1)

1. ch 4, slip st 1 in first ch (form ring):







The eyes are crocheted using white yarn (hook size 2.5 - 3.5 (e.g. "Catania") as well as your C hook size 2. Furthermore the eyes won't be stuffed and subsequently they are sewn onto the head (cf. fig.)




 \rightarrow fasten off the last sc afterwards; cut yarn with scissors, leave a tail of about 10 inches (which you'll need to sew the eyes onto the head in the next step)

 \rightarrow afterwards you have to crochet the templates of the eyes

4. templates of the eyes (make 2)

The templates of the eyes are crocheted using yarn (hook size 2.5 - 3.5 (e.g. "Catania") as well as your C hook size 2.



<u>Step in between – Finalising the eye area</u>

 \rightarrow the eyes will be pinned in the right place onto the templates

 \rightarrow after that the finished eye area will be sewn onto the stem with sewing yarn (see pictures)



5. nose

The nose of the small mushroom will be made using needle size B and yarn for needle size C-D(E) (orchid). During crocheting the nose will be stuffed with fiberfill firmly.

 \rightarrow before the leaves will be crocheted: the decision should be made if the mushroom are to be in a group or individually

 \rightarrow if the mushroom should be individually – please keep in mind that you will need fewer leaves.

 \rightarrow compare the following steps for your own decision

1. the individual mushroom (exemplified by the middle mushroom)

 \rightarrow for each mushroom you can proceed as follows: it can stand alone (important: the leaves serve here additionally as a standing aid) or it can be decorated in flower pots or in wooden bowls (see fig. below):



 \rightarrow if the mushroom should stand separately: the leaves will be arranged as follows:



circle and fix them with pins; after that the leaves can be sewn onto the bottom of the stem with sewing thread



then also arranged the large leaves in a circle, fix them, and finally the large leaves will be sewn onto the stem

 \rightarrow if the individual mushroom should be decorated in a bowl or a cup, it is recommended that the bowl is filled with decorative sand or granules / pebbles

 \rightarrow for group formation the mushrooms are sewn together; see figures below (the arrows indicate the points where the mushroom can be sewn to each other)

Leaves


Two different leaf sizes were crocheted, which are different in size and color only, but in the design are the same; compare the overall picture:




Procedure crocheting for each leaf:

There will be crocheting back and forth in rows only, finishing each row with a turning chain.

<u>1.small leaf</u> (19 leaves)



 \rightarrow don't finish last stitch \rightarrow crochet (sc) around all edges of the leaf once first (check the arrow guide); compare the fig. on the next page




Finalising the small leaves






