- 18" x 13" piece 32-count lambswool linen or 16-count lambswool Aida from Wichelt Imports, Inc.
- One skein each DMC® or Anchor® six-strand embroidery floss*
- One spool Kreinik® Very Fine Braid #4*
- Size 24 tapestry needle
- *Refer to color code.

Stitch count: 208H x 138W

Design size: 13" x 8 5/8"

Instructions: Cross stitch over two threads on linen or over one square on Aida, using two strands of floss or one strand of very fine braid. Backstitch using one strand of floss unless otherwise indicated. Attach beads, using one strand of matching floss.

Backstitch instructions:

Stocking Finishing Instructions

Materials:

- Purchased cording (NOTE: See Step 2 to determine length needed.)
- Backing fabric to complement or match cross-stitch fabric
- 1/4 yd. lining fabric to complement or match cross-stitch fabric
- Thread to match fabrics and cording
- Hand-sewing needle
- Ruler
- Tape measure
- Fabric-marking pencil
- Straight pins
- Scissors
- Steam iron
- Sewing machine (optional)

NOTE: Please read all instructions carefully before beginning.

1. Press stitched piece from back, straightening fabric as much as possible. Use fabric-marking pencil to draw a line to form the shape of a stocking,

referring to pattern and staying on grain-line of fabric when possible. **DO NOT** cut fabric. Place stocking over a piece of backing fabric (right sides together) and pin layers together along edge of stitching.

2. Calculate approximate circumference of your finished stocking by measuring the line you have just drawn. Add 18" for top of stocking and hanger to this measurement to determine the length of cording.

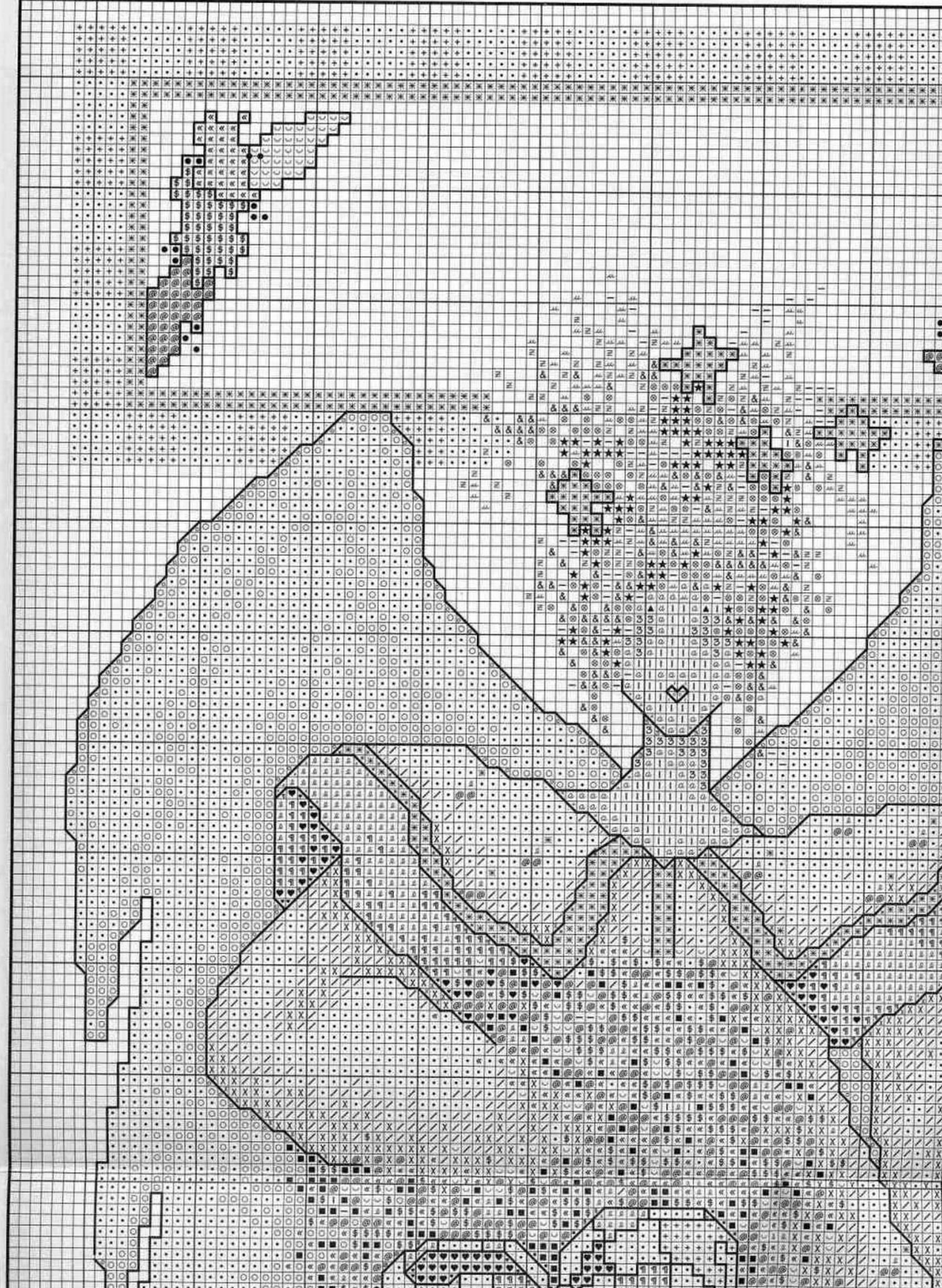
3. Sew around stocking along drawn line, leaving top of stocking open to turn. Remove pins. Trim all layers to seam allowances of 1/4", leaving 1" at top. Clip curves as needed.

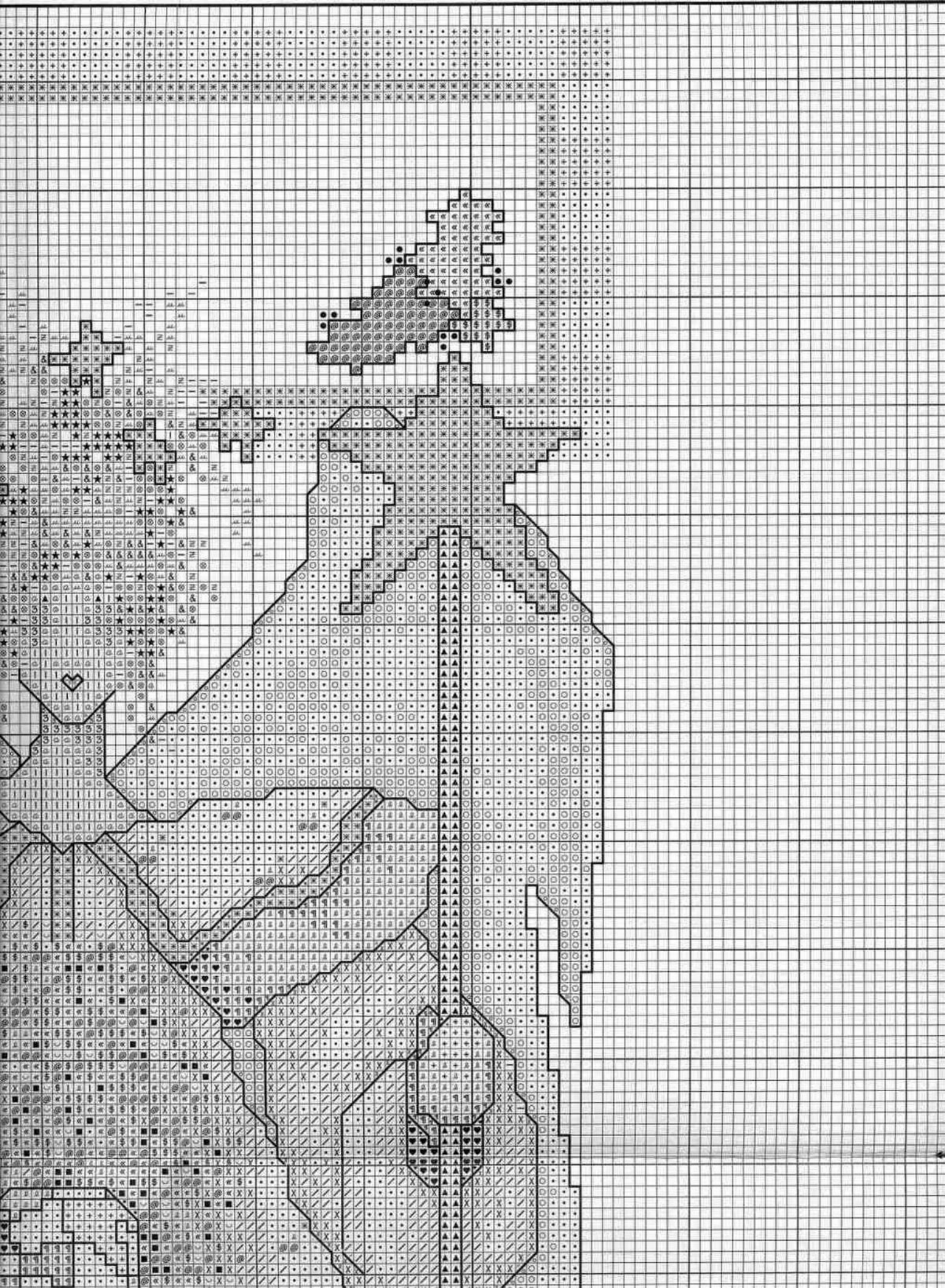
4. With right sides of lining fabric together, trace stocking shape on lining fabric, using fabric-marking pencil and stitched stocking as a pattern. **DO NOT** cut fabric. Pin layers together.

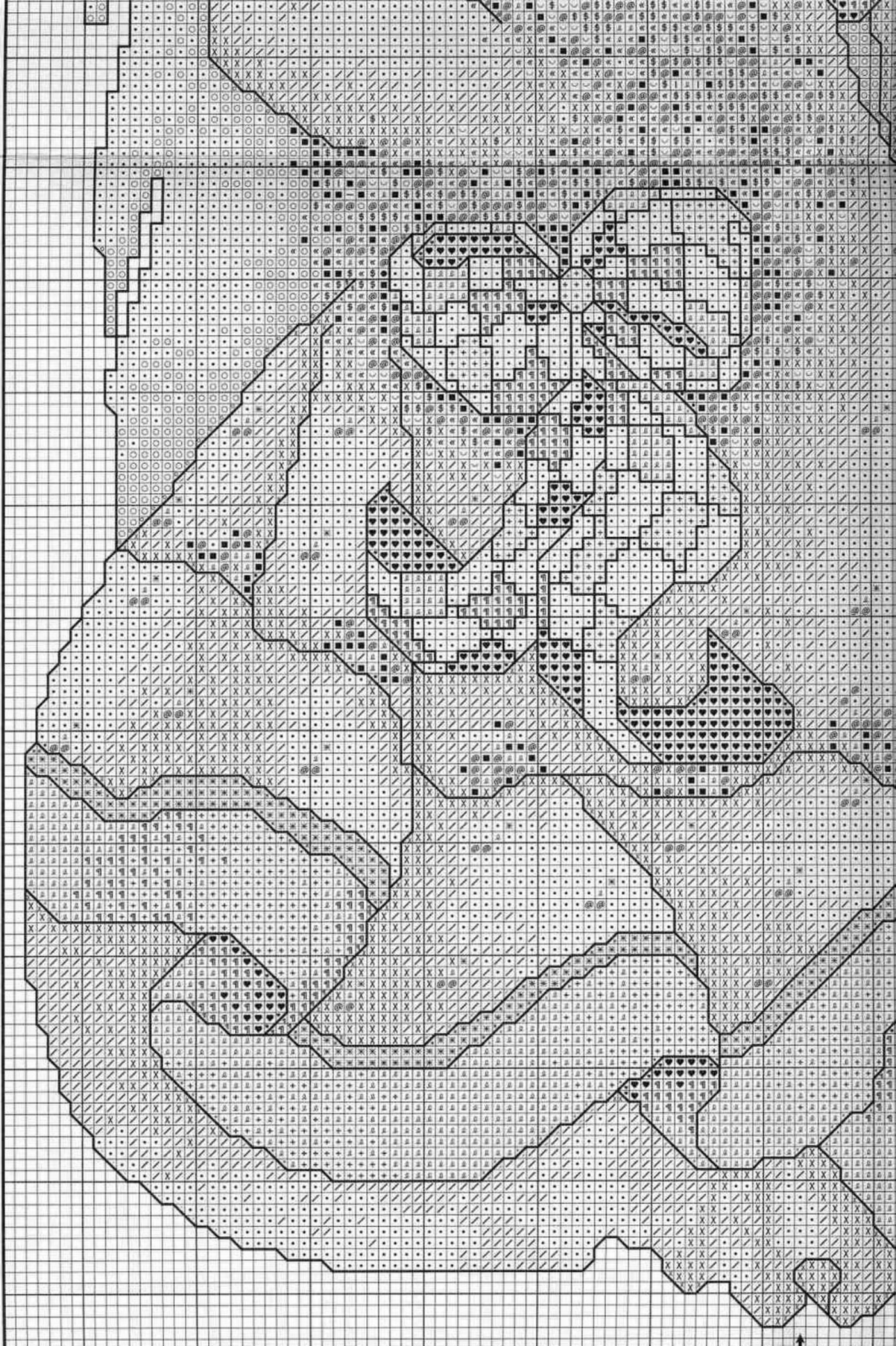
5. Sew around stocking lining 1/8" inside drawn line, leaving top of stocking open and an opening at bottom to turn. (NOTE: So that stocking lining will fit stocking at top, taper seam back to drawn line approximately 1" from top line of stocking.) Remove pins. Trim all layers to seam allowances of 1/4", leaving 1" at top. Clip curves as needed. Turn stocking lining right-side out.

6. Place stocking (right-side out) inside stocking lining (right-side in), matching tops and seams. Pin layers together. Sew along drawn line at top of stocking and stocking lining. Remove pins. Trim all layers to seam allowances of 1/4". Pull stocking out through opening in lining and insert lining into stocking. Press from back side.

7. Secure cut ends of cording with stitches. Blind stitch cording to stocking sides, around stocking top, and for hanger, using sewing thread to match cording and concealing cut ends.
