Small amount of Red Heart Super Saver yarn in Red for mouth

Red Heart Designer Sport yarn in Ivory (for face)

Lion Brand WoolEase in White Frost (for trim)

Polyfill

Pair of 12mm black post eyes

One pair of 2" wide doll eyeglasses

Three tiny red buttons (about ¼" round) and 2 - 10 mm pearls for earrings.

Sizes G and E crochet hooks

Yarn needle

Powder blush

Little holly pick for hat (optional)

Thick Tacky glue

****NOTE: Use Size G hook except where noted****

HEAD

With Ivory yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic circle 6 stitches (if you don't know what a magic circle is, there is an

excellent video demonstrating it on Utube: Here is the link: <http://ca.youtube.com/>

watch?v=WLuSVyKvoUg

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnd 8: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnds 9 – 12: sc in each sc

Rnd 13: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 54 sc

Rnds 14 – 15: sc in each sc

Rnd 16: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnds 17 – 18: sc in each sc

Rnd 19: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnd 20: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 21: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 22: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 23: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Start to stuff. Put a little extra stuffing in front of face for cheeks.

Rnd 24: *sc 2 tog, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 12 sc

Rnd 25: sc 2 tog till closed, finishing stuffing before fully closing. End off.

NOSE:

With Ivory yarn and Size E hook:

Magic circle 4, join. Using a yarn needle sew the little circle into kind of a ball.

Push and glue eyes into place on face as shown.

Sew nose onto face as shown.

Using the Bright Red yarn, sew a tiny mouth below the nose.

Put some powder blush on her cheeks and place the eyeglasses on her face as shown.

(I cut the looped ends off the eyeglasses and sanded the ends smooth so that they

would slip inside the face easily) You can put a little glue on the ends to hold them in

place if you want.

EYEBROWS

With Caron yarn in White:

Chain 5, weave in ends on right side.

Glue eyebrows, right side down onto face as shown in my photo below:

BODY /DRESS

Starting with Caron yarn in White:

Rnd 1: Magic circle 6 stitches

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: sc in each sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 8: sc in each sc

Rnd 9: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnds 10 – 18: sc in each sc, end off.

The part of the body you just finished is from the neck to the waist.

The head will be attached to the top closed part of this piece later on.

Attach Red yarn.

Rnd 19: 2 sc in each sc – 84 sc ****Now for the tedious part!****

Rnds 20 – 54: sc in each sc around, end off.

RUFFLE

With White Frost yarn:

Attach to any st, working in front loops only:

Ch 3, hdc in same stitch, ch 3, *(hdc, ch 3, hdc) in next stitch, ch 3; rep from *

around. Do not end off.

Now repeat the above in the back loops. End off, weave in tail. See my finished ruffle

SASH

With Green yarn:

Chain 42

Row 1: sc in each ch, ch 1, turn

Rows 2 – 4: sc in each sc, ch 1, turn.

Row 5: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail.

You will be attaching this belt later on.

ARMS With White yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6 – 6 sc

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnds 4 – 14: sc in each sc

Rnd 15: *sc 2 tog, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 12 sc

Rnds 16 – 21: sc in each sc, attach Red yarn

Rnd 22: 2 sc in each sc – 24 sc, end off.

Turn up the last 3 or 4 rows as cuff.

Lightly stuff arms, leaving the very top less full for attaching to shoulders later on.

MITTENS

With Green yarn and E hook:

THUMB:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 5

Rnds 2 – 3: sc in each sc, end off, weaving in tail

HAND:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc, 12 sc

Rnds 3 – 4: sc in each sc

Rnd 5: sc 2 tog, sc in next 4 sc; repeat – 10 sc

Rnd 6: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail.

Tack the thumb to the hand by sewing two stitches from each together.

Attach the yarn again and sc around both as one piece, picking up about 11 stitches.

Continue to sc around for 2 more rows, end off.

Lightly stuff the mittens and insert them into arms as shown in my photos. Tack them
in place.

Finished mitten:

LEGS

With White yarn:

Ch 42 (beg loop counts as one ch) Join.

Rnd 1: sc in each ch – 42 sc

Rnds 2 – 12: sc in each sc

Rnd 13: Count 21 stitches from hook. Insert hook into 22nd stitch (you have now made the separation for the legs), and continue to sc around the one leg making sure you are holding your work with the right side facing.

Sc for 17 rows. End off. Each leg should be 21 stitches around.

Attach the yarn again to the other leg and sc for 17 rows around the second leg. End off. See my photo below for the finished legs.

****Note: I added more rows to my legs after I attached them, so the photo shows less rows in the legs than I told you to do.*****

Stuff the white section of the body piece. Lift up the skirt and attach the legs section to the last white row of the body section just before the red skirt. There were 42 stitches in the top of the legs section and the waist section, so they should match up.

Use an overcast stitch as shown in my photos below:

Stuff the legs nice and firmly. See my photo below for finished legs fully attached and stuffed: Attach the green sash around the waist, with the first chain row up, sewing it to itself

in the back. You may tack it in place so that it stays down.

Sew the arms to the top of the body as shown.

TOP PART OF BOOTS

With Black yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc
Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnds 5 – 11: sc in each sc

Rnd 12: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnds 13 – 16: sc in each sc, attach Red yarn

Rnd 17: sc

Rnd 18: sl st in each sc, end off.

FRONT OR TOE PART OF BOOTS

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnds 4 – 6: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail.

Using tail, sew front part of boots onto upright part, stuffing as you go.

Firmly stuff top part of boot and using yarn needle and black yarn, sew a running

stitch all the way around through 3rd row down from top edge of boot onto second

row up from bottom of legs, continue to firmly stuff both legs and boots before fully closing.

Turn down top edge of boot for cuff.

****Note:** The bottom of the dress (ruffle) should be about 1 ½ inches up from floor, so that when you look down you can see her little boots. This is so that she doesn't get

her dress muddy when she's out working in the woods with her Woodland Santa hubby.

She's holding up her dress so that you can see her boots and by the way, she has knees which you can make by taking two little stitches at the knee area and pulling them towards each other to indent the kneecaps: Using White yarn and yarn needle, sew head to top of body.

HAT

With Red yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic circle 6 stitches

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 7: sc in each sc

Rnd 8: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnd 9: *2 sc in next 6 sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnd 10: sc in each sc

Rnd 11: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 54 sc

Rnd 12: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 8 sc; rep from * around – 60 sc

Rnd 13: sc in each sc

Rnd 14: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 9 sc; rep from * around – 66 sc

Rnds 15 – 18: sc in each sc

Rnd 19: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 55 sc

Rnd 20: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 44 sc

Rnd 21: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 33 sc, end off, weaving in tail. Attach White Frost yarn.

Ch 3, hdc in same stitch, ch 3, *(hdc, ch 3, hdc) in next stitch, ch 3; rep from *

around. Sl st in first ch 3, end off, weaving in tail.

Place hat on her head, tacking it in place with Red yarn.

Push the little holly pick into her hat and glue in place.

Sew the three tiny buttons on her dress as shown.

Sew the 2 white pearls onto the sides of her face for earrings.

Photo below also shows her already wearing her cape which you will be making next.

CAPE With Red yarn: Ch 25

Row 1: sc in each ch – 24 sc, ch 1, turn (each ch 1 counts as 1 sc)

Row 2: * sc in same st as ch, sc in next 5 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep

from * across, ch 1, turn

Row 3: * sc in same st as ch, sc in next 6 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; rep

from * across, ch 1, turn

Row 4: * sc in same st as ch, sc in next 7 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc; rep

from * across, ch 1, turn

Row 5: * sc in same st as ch, sc in next 8 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 8 sc; rep

from * across, ch 1, turn
Row 6: * sc in same st as ch, sc in next 9 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 9 sc; rep

from * across, ch 1, turn

Row 7: * sc in same st as ch, sc in next 10 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 10 sc; rep

from * across, ch 1, turn

Row 8: sc in same st as ch, sc in each remaining sc across, ch 1, turn

Rows 9 - 16: rep row 8, don't end off.

Continue up side of cape with 1 sc in the end of each row.

When you get to the top of the cape (first chain row), do 2 dc in each chain across the top.

Continue down the other side with 1 sc in each row down to the bottom. End off.

Attach White Frost Yarn to corner of bottom edge of cape.

Ch 2, sc in same stitch, ch 2, *(sc, ch 2, sc) in next stitch, ch 2; rep from * across

bottom. Sl st in next st, end off, weaving in tail.

TIE FOR CAPE

With Green yarn:

Chain 105, end off.

Using yarn needle, weave chain through top of cape just before dc edge. Go through

every other hole between stitches.

Place cape around Mrs. Santa's neck and make a bow with tie.

Now Mrs. Santa is ready to join her hubby in his Christmas

preparations. Hope you had fun!

WOODLAND SANTA

MATERIALS

**Note all yarn used was worsted weight, 4-ply except for pom pom which was 3 ply.

You may substitute any yarns of your choice. The yarns I used are listed below:

Caron Simply Soft yarn in White (for beard and hair), Autumn Red, Black, Dark Sage

(for mittens and scarf)

Tiny amount of Red Heart Super Saver yarn in Gold (for buckle)

Small amount of Red Heart Super Saver yarn in Red for mouth, tie around sack and tie

around teddy

Red Heart Designer Sport yarn in Ivory (for face)

Lion Brand WoolEase in White Frost (for trim only)

Bernat Softee Baby 3 ply yarn in White (for pompom)

TLC Heathers yarn in Nutmeg (for sack)

Bernat Satin yarn in Camel (for teddy)

Polyfill

Sizes G and D crochet hooks (D hook is only for Teddy)

Yarn needle White and tan thread and regular sewing needle

Pair of 12mm black post eyes for Santa

Pair of 6mm flat back eyes for teddy

One pair of 2" wide doll eyeglasses (optional)

Piece of 2" cardboard to wrap yarn around for pompom

Stiffy fabric stiffener or thick tacky glue (to stiffen buckle)

Powder blush

Little gift boxes for inside sack (shown) or other Christmas decoration of your choice (I

just wrapped pieces of foam)

HEAD

With Ivory yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic circle 6 stitches (if you don't know what a magic circle is, there is an

excellent video demonstrating it on Utube: Here is the link: [http://ca.youtube.com/](http://ca.youtube.com/watch?v=WLuSVyKvoUg)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnd 8: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnds 9 – 12: sc in each sc

Rnd 13: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 54 sc

Rnds 14 – 15: sc in each sc

Rnd 16: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnds 17 – 18: sc in each sc

Rnd 19: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnd 20: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 21: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 22: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc
Rnd 23: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Start to stuff. Put a little extra stuffing in front of face for cheeks.

Rnd 24: *sc 2 tog, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 12 sc

Rnd 25: sc 2 tog till closed, finishing stuffing before fully closing. End off.

BODY/COAT With Red yarn: Chain 6

Rnd 1: Sc in each ch, 3 sc in end ch

Continue going around bottom of ch

3 sc in end sc. – 18 sc

Rnds 2 – 4: sc in each sc, except always 3 sc in each end.

Rnd 5: sc in each sc except do 2 sc in each of the 4 stitches in each end. (in other words you will be increasing 4 stitches in each end)

Place a marker in the last stitch you made in this round and don't move it as you continue future rows. Because if you move it and put it in each last stitch of each new

row you will find that it will always move one stitch over to the left as you go and you don't want that for this pattern. You want to keep the ending stitches in a straight line.

Rnd 6: sc in each sc up to marker

In the next row we will be increasing only on one side. This will be the side that bulges out a little for his belly.

Rnd 7: sc in next sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * 4 times more, 2 sc in next sc, sc in remaining sc – you should have about 47 sc at this point.

Rnds 8 – 12: sc in each sc

Rnd 13: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * 3 times more, 2 sc in next sc, sc in remaining sc – 52 sc

Rnds 14 – 17: sc in each sc

Rnd 18: sc in next 2 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * 3 times more, 2 sc in next sc, sc in remaining sc – 57 sc

Rnds 19 – 20: sc in each sc

Rnd 21: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around (note there will be 7 sc in last sequence) – 64 sc

Rnds 22 – 26: sc in each sc, end off.

LEGS

With Red yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6 – 6 sc

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc
Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnds 4 – 5: sc in each sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnds 7 – 16 sc in each sc

Rnd 17: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 28 sc

Rnds 18 – 19: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail.

Catching 4 sts from the top of each leg, sew them together at top.

Re-attach yarn in one leg at the center joining spot.

Rnd 1: sc around both legs as one – 48 sc

Rnds 2 – 4: sc in each sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 56 sc

Rnds 6 – 7: sc in each sc, end off.

Partially stuff the body and legs. Turn up the bottom edge of the body/jacket up to

the 5th row. Using my photos below as a guide, sew the legs to the stitches of the fifth

row of the jacket using an overcast stitch. Finish stuffing just before you close.

Sew head onto body, pushing the head down into the top of the body and using a back

stitch back and forth between the body and the head. See my photos below showing

head sewn on. Note, my photos do not show the extra stuffing in the cheeks because

I added it later with great difficulty. I saved you the trouble by telling you to put it in

while the head was still open. Ha.

ARMS

With Red yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6 – 6 sc

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnds 5 – 15: sc in each sc

Rnd 16: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 20 sc

Rnds 17 – 20: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail to sew mittens in arms later.

MITTENS

With Green yarn:

(Thumb part)

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 8

Rnds 2 – 3: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail to attach to hand part.

(Hand part)

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 7

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 14 sc

Rnds 3 – 4: sc in each sc

Rnd 5: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 12 sc.

Do not end off, leave hook right where it is.

Sew the thumb to the opposite side of the hand that the hook is in. See my photo of

one mitten at this point and one mitten finished: Rnd 6: Continue sc around both parts as one. You should have about 17 sc.

Rnd 7: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around (last sequence will have only 3 sc) – 14 sc

Rnds 8 – 10: sc in each sc, end off. Weaving in tail.

Stuff arms. Don't stuff the arms too tightly, especially at the top. Only put a scant

amount of stuffing in the mittens. Place mittens inside arms up to the third row of

mittens. Using the tail of yarn left from arm, tack the mitten in place using a running

stitch around the end of the arm.

Sew arms onto body as shown in photo, about one row down from head and slightly

tilting forward. ****Note**** make sure the thumbs are pointing up.

HAT

With Red yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6 – 6 sc

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnds 3 – 4: sc in each sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 8: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 9: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnds 10 – 12: sc in each sc

Rnd 13: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 13 sc; rep from * around – 45 sc

Rnds 14 – 15: sc in each sc Rnd 16: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 14 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnds 17 – 19 – sc in each sc, end off, weave in tail.

Attach Frost White yarn.

Rnds 1 – 4: hdc in each st

Rnd 5: sl st in each st, end off.

Fold up the White Frost part.

POMPOM

With White 3 ply yarn:

Wrap yarn around piece of cardboard about 75 times. Tightly tie a double piece of

yarn around one end and slip it off the cardboard. Cut open the other end. Proceed to

cut and snip and shape the yarn into a ball about 1 " in diameter. Sew it onto the top

of the hat as shown in my photo.

TOP PART OF BOOTS

With Black yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnds 5 – 11: sc in each sc

Rnd 12: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnds 13 – 17: sc in each sc
Rnd 18: sl st in each sc, end off. Turn down top of boot for a cuff.

FRONT OR TOE PART OF BOOTS

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnds 4 – 7: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail.

Using tail, sew front part of boots onto upright part, stuffing as you go.

Put a little stuffing in top part of boot and sew onto bottom of legs as shown.

TRIM FOR COAT AND ARMS

With Frosty White yarn:

FOR DOWN FRONT OF COAT:

Ch 50, hdc in each ch, continue hdc around bottom of ch, end off.

Sew to front of coat as shown.

FOR AROUND NECK

Ch 31 (the beginning loop will count as one ch) – 32 ch

Row 1: Sc in each ch – 30 sc, ch 1, turn

Row 2: sc in same sc as ch, sc in next 4 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from

* across – 36 sc, ch 1, turn

Row 3: sc in same sc as ch, sc in next 5 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from

* across – 42 sc, end off, leaving tail.

Place around neck and tie in front.

FOR AROUND BOTTOM OF COAT:

With Frosty White yarn:

Row 1: Ch 50, hdc in each ch, ch 2, turn

Row 2: hdc in each st, ch 2, turn
Row 3: hdc in each st, end off.

Sew top row of trim to bottom row of coat. In other words, the last two rows of the

trim will be hanging down below the coat.

FOR AROUND ARMS:

With Frosty White yarn:

Row 1: ch 20, hdc in each ch, ch 2, turn

Row 2: hdc in each st, ch 2, turn

Row 3: hdc in each st, end off.

Sew trim to each arm as shown, making sure the join is facing the body so it is less visible.

BELT

With Black yarn:

Row 1: Ch 60, sc in each, ch 1, turn

Row 2: sc in each sc, continue a few sc around end to give a rounded look, end off.

Sew belt around waist as shown with the rounded end hanging down.

BELT BUCKLE

With Gold yarn:

Ch 18, join to itself, end off, weaving in tail.

Put a piece of waxed paper over something you can stick pins into like a rubber mat,

etc.

Soak buckle in Stiffy or slightly watered down white glue and shape into a rectangle as

shown in my photo. Use pins to hold it in place on the waxed paper and let dry

overnight.

Glue buckle onto front of belt, letting end of belt hang down as shown.

Photo below shows all trim on body in place, except for collar, which I added after I

took this photo. Next you will complete the face.

NOSE: With Ivory yarn:

Magic circle 4, sc in each st, end off.

Push and glue eyes into place on face as shown.

Sew nose onto face as shown.

Using the Bright Red yarn, sew a tiny mouth below the nose.

EYEBROWS: (Make 2) With White yarn: Ch 6.

Sew the eyebrows just above the eyes as shown using white thread.

MUSTACHE

With White yarn:

Ch 16, then working across each ch:

Sl st in next 2 ch, sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc, sl st, sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc, sl st in last 2 ch, end off.

Using white thread, sew mustache onto face as shown. (The thread is less visible than yarn would be)

BEARD

With White yarn:

Make a chain long enough to go around the head starting and ending at the back of the head and coming around the front just below his mouth. (My chain was about 40 long)

Row 1: sc in each sc

Row 2: sc in front loop only of next sc from hook, ch 2, sc in same sc, *sc in front

loop of next sc, ch 2, sc in same sc; rep from * across, then you will be going back

across same row going into the back loop:

*Sc in back loop, ch 3, sc in same loop; rep from * across, end off.

Sew this piece onto the top of the head. See my profile photo of Santa without his hat

on to show placement.

Make a second chain long enough to go around again under where you sewed the last piece.

Row 1: sc in each sc

Row 2: sc in front loop only of next sc from hook, ch 3, sc in same sc, *sc in front

loop of next sc, ch 3, sc in same sc; rep from *

across.

*Sc in back loop, ch 4, sc in same loop; rep from * across, end off.

Sew onto head below previous piece.

Make a third chain long enough to go around under the last one.

Repeat instructions as for last 2 pieces, but this time make it a chain 4 in the front

loops and chain 5 in the back loops.

Sew to head under last piece.

Just as you did for the third piece, make another piece about half the length as the

previous ones, just to fill in more behind his head.

Make another piece about 50 ch long, complete it the same way as the others, but this

time do 5 ch in front loops and 6 in back loops.

Bend this piece in half and sew it to itself at the chain edge.

This will be a very full piece to lengthen the beard just in the front.

Tack this piece to the front under the other pieces, and tack the ends tightly up into the sides.

Now you should have a nice full beard and hair going around the head, leaving him a nice little bald spot on top of his head.

I put a little blush on his bald spot.

Put his hat on. You may tack it in place if you want. SCARF

With Sage yarn:

Ch 80

Row 1: sc in each ch, ch1, turn

Rows 2 – 7: sc in each sc

Fringe:

Cut 14, 3" pieces of Sage yarn

At 7 points spaced evenly at each end of scarf, insert hook, pull up a loop from each 3"

piece, grab the ends with the hook and pull them through the loop. Pull tightly.

Tie the scarf around Santa's neck as shown.

SACK of TOYS

With Nutmeg yarn:

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnd 4: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around – 24 sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around – 30 sc

Rnd 6: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around – 36 sc

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnd 8: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc

Rnds 9 – 10: sc in each sc

Rnd 11: * 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 54 sc

Rnds 12 – 15: sc in each sc

Rnd 16: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 7 sc; rep from * around – 48 sc
Rnds 17 – 18: sc in each sc

Rnd 19: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around – 42 sc

Rnds 20 – 27: sc in each sc

Rnd 28: sl st in each st, end off, weaving in tail.

Using 2 strands of the Super Saver red yarn (same as for mouth),

Chain 70, end off.

Weave this chain in and out of all the stitches around the top of the sack at about the

4th row down.

Lightly stuff the sack and put some tiny wrapped packages inside sticking out like I did

or you can put holly leaves, or other Christmas decorations inside if you'd like.

TEDDY With Camel yarn and D hook:

HEAD

Rnd 1: Magic Circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: sc in each sc

Rnd 4: 2 sc in each of next 4 sc, sc in rem sc – 16 sc

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * 3 more times,

Sc 2 tog, sc in next sc, sc 2 tog, sc in next sc, sc 2 tog – 17 sc

Rnd 6: sc in each sc

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc, rep from * around – 23 sc

(note there will be only 1 sc in last sequence)Rnd 8: sc in each sc

Rnd 9: *sc 2 tog, sc in next 2 sc, rep from * around – 17 sc (only 1 sc in last

sequence)

Rnd 10: *sc 2 tog, sc in next sc; rep from * around, (ending in sc 2 tog) – 11 sc

Stuff the head.

Rnd 11: sc 2 tog til closed.

With Black yarn on yarn needle, sew 3 tiny stitches on face for nose as shown. Sew a

tiny stitch down from nose and 2 tiny stitches on each side as shown for mouth.

Run tan thread up from bottom of head, sew a tiny stitch where each eye will be placed and pull to indent eye socket.

Glue the eyes in sockets.

EARS

Magic circle 6, but do not join. (you should have a little half circle) Weave in yarn ends and sew ears onto head using tan thread.

BODY

Rnd 1: Magic circle 6

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc – 12 sc

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 18 sc

Rnds 4 – 8: sc in each sc

Rnd 9: *sc 2 tog, sc in next sc; rep from * around – 12 sc, end off, leaving tail to

attach head. Stuff body.

Attach head to open end of body.

ARMS

Rnd 1: Magic circle 6

Rnds 2 – 8: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail. Sew arms to body as shown. Do not

stuff arms.

LEGS

Rnd 1: Magic circle 8

Rnds 2 – 9: sc in each sc, end off, leaving tail.

Put just a tiny bit of stuffing in legs, but none in bottom (foot)

Sew legs to body as shown. Turn ends of legs upward for feet. Using tan thread, run some stitches on the instep

of the foot to hold it upward.

SCARF

WOODLAND SANTA



With Red yarn:

Ch 30, end off, weaving in tails.

Tie the little scarf around the teddy's neck.

Tack the little Teddy in Santa's right arm as shown.

Tack the red chain of the sack into Santa's left hand as shown.

Now Santa is ready to deliver his gifts! Hope you had fun!
