





# Lucky Doll

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### Notice about the pattern

- I use USA terms for this pattern
- -My lucky dolls are crocheted with the back side facing outwards !!!!





- -This pattern includes instructions for:
- \* The basic doll
- \* Long Tail Pixie Hat
- \* Jamaica Hat

- -Finished basic doll is approximately 4 inches /9,5 cm tall sitting and without hat.
- You can use all type of yarn you want. Be careful to use the adapted crochet hook's size.
- -You can use a smaller hook than recommended to be sure your work is tight.
- I used 2 mm eyes for my dolls. You can use an other size but it will result in different looks.
- I advice starting by crocheting arms and legs especially if you have one ball of yarn in each color.



### **MATERIALS**

- 2mm crochet hook
- -. Cotton yarn (100% cotton / White and antique pink)
- sewing needles
- Yarn neddle
- black sewing thread (for embroidering the mouth).
- -Scissors
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- 2 black eyes or 2 black beads 2mm diameter
- -Optional: felted balls or jewells for the hat's embellishment.



#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

- st = stitch(es)
- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- dec = decrease (2sc together)
- inc = increase (2sc in one stitch)
- rep = repeat
- tog = together
- -FO = finish off



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 Using white yarn.

 Rnd 1. 4sc in magic ring
 4 sts

 Rnd 2. [1 inc] x 4
 8 sts

 Rnd 3/4. 1sc in each st around
 8 sts

 Rnd 5. [1 dec] x 4
 4sts

Continue with another dec to close the hole and \* ch 1

\*[1sc in the back loops of the previous st/ ch1] x 10

\*F0 and leave an 4 inch thread tail for sewing.

### ARMS

Using white yarn.

 Rnd 1. 4sc in magic ring
 4 sts

 Rnd 2. [1 inc] x 4
 8 sts

 Rnd 3/4. 1sc in each st around
 8 sts

 Rnd 5. [1 dec] x 4
 4sts


Continue with another dec to close the hole Change color and use the pink yarn

- \* ch 1
- \* [1sc in the back loops of the previous st/ ch1] x 8
- \* F0 and leave an 4 inch thread tail for sewing.

## Tips and Advices for the body.

- \*Attention please... I use the white yarn for the instructions on pictures. But you need to use the pink yarn.
- \* Work around the crocheted foundation chain in rounds. Don't turn your work.
- \* Work sc in back loops only for Rnd 6.
- \* Sew the legs on the Rnd 5 ( see pictures) and sew the arms on the Rnd 16.
- \* Start to stuff your doll when the body is completed.
- \*Change color of the yarn and work with white yarn at the Rnd 18.





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HEAD	
Using white yarn	
Rnd 18. [inc] x 15	30 sts
Rnd 19. [4sc, inc] x6	36 sts
Rnd 20. [5sc, inc] x6	42 sts
Rnd 21. [6sc, inc] x6	48 sts
Rnd 22/26. 1sc in each st around	48 sts
Rnd 27. [6sc, dec] x6	42 sts
Rnd 28. [5sc, dec] x6	36 sts
Rnd 29. [4sc, dec] x6	30 sts
Rnd 30. [3sc, dec] x6	24 sts
Rnd 31. [2sc, dec] x6	18 sts
Rnd 32. [1sc, dec] x6	12 sts
Rnd 33. [dec] x6	6 sts

Continue with 1 or 2 dec to close the hole. FO and sew the lasts sts tog; weave in loose ends.







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## Tips and Advices for the face.

- \* Put the eyes at Round 24
- \*Embroider the mouth like you can see on the detailed pictures below.
- \* You can moove the eyes (Picture 5) where you want, depending the facial expression you want to archieve. You don't to have to respect the steps for the mouth. You can embroider a bigger or smaller mouth.



OK!!! Your doll is on the right way... Now, all you need to do is give it a beautiful hat !!!

Rnd 30.	[4sc, inc] x 6	36 sts	
Rnd 31.	1sc in each st around	36 sts	
Rnd 32.	[5sc, inc] x 6	42 sts	
Rnd 33.	1sc in each st around	42 sts	
Rnd 34.	[6sc, inc] x 6	48 sts	
Rnd 35.	[7sc, inc] x 6	54 sts	
	. 1sc in each st around	54 sts	
Rnd 38.	[7sc, dec] x 6	48 sts	
Rnd 39.	1sc in each st around	48 sts	
Rnd 40.	[6sc, dec] x 6	42 sts	
Rnd 41.	[5sc, dec] x 6	36 sts	

FO: Cut the yarn and and weave the 4 inches tail up and down throught some sts. Cut off any excess. You can sew the hat to the head if you want.

Rnd 2.	[inc] x 6	12 sts		
Rnd 3.	[1sc, inc] x 6	18 sts		
Rnd 4.	[2sc, inc] x 6	24 sts		
Rnd 5.	[3sc, inc] x 6	30 sts		
Rnd 6.	[4sc, inc] x 6	36 sts		
Rnd 7.	[5sc, inc] x 6	42 sts		
Rnd 8.	[6sc, inc] x 6	48 sts		
Rnd 9.	[7sc, inc] x 6	54 sts		
Rnd 10/22.	54 sts			
Rnd23.	[7sc, dec] x 6	48 sts		
Rnd 24/32	1sc in each st around	48 sts		
Rnd33.	[6sc, dec] x 6	42 sts		
Rnd 34.	[5 sc, dec] x6	36 sts		

FO: Cut the yarn and and weave the 4 inches tail up and down throught some sts. Cut off any excess. You can sew the hat to the head if you want.


















You can sew some felted balls and accessories to decorate and embellish the hats. I found them in craft's store.



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## Some additional tips.

# How to change colors in the crochet.

Leave the last single crochet stitch unfinished. Grab the new color of yarn with your crochet hook.

Pull up a loop with the new color.

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Continue by crocheting sc with the new color.

### How to make invisible decrease

- \*Insert hook into **back loops only** of the next 2 stitches (don't forget: the **back side facing outwards** !!!!) Pictures 1 & 2
- \*Yarn over, pull through 2 loops on hook. (3)
- \*Yarn over, pull through final 2 loops on hook. (4)
