

# Rambert the Ram

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## Materials

- Yarn/wool: I have used Catania yarn from Schachenmayr in beige (0263), white (0106) and dark grey (0387) color. Brasília yarn from Schachenmayr in white (00001).
- Crochet hook: 3.0 mm
- Approx. 60 cm of single core copper PVC-coated electrical wire (diameter: 3 mm)
- Rubber tape (electrician's tape) 1,5 cm wide to secure wire ends
- Tapestry needle
- Filling
- Scissors
- Pliers for cutting wire
- Two 10 mm black safety eyes
- Optional: small pebble (diagonal: 2 - 4 cm) to make Rambert's bottom heavier

## Abbreviations

St(s)	-	stitch(es)
Ch	-	chain
Sc	-	single crochet
Inc	-	increase (2 sc in next st)
Dec	-	decrease (2 sc worked off together)
Slst	-	slip stitch
(nr)	-	indicates the total number of stitches in the current row/round
FO	-	fasten off

## Important Notes

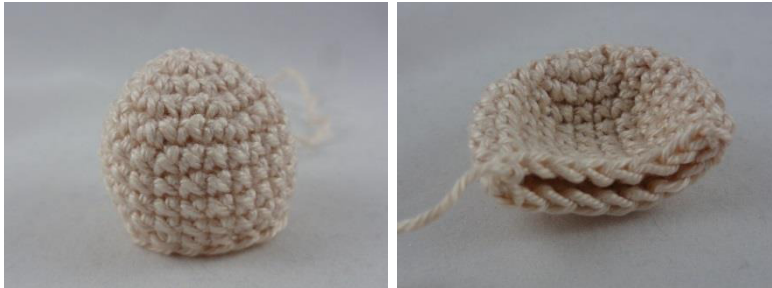
- All rounds are worked in a continuous spiral (except Rambert's eyelids). Do not join or turn, unless instructed otherwise
- You may find it useful to use a stitchmarker for counting your rounds
- Take your time to create your amigurumi's face, it is a very important part of the final result
- While stuffing and making the wire frame take care to give each part a nice shape
- using invisible decrease instead of decrease makes the final result nicer

## Size of finished figure

using the given yarn and hook size Rambert will be 16 cm by 22 cm.

# Realization

## Mouth

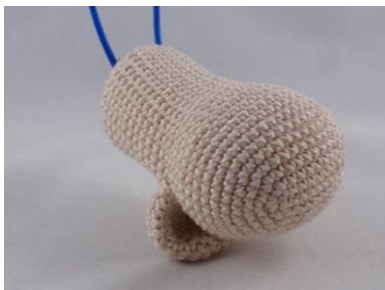


With beige yarn:

Round 1.	6 sc in double adjustable ring	(6)
Round 2.	inc*	(12)
Round 3.	(sc, inc)*	(18)
Round 4.	(2 sc, inc)*	(24)
Round 5.	- Round 8. sc*	(24)
Round 9.	(2 sc, dec)*	(18)

## Head



With beige yarn:

Round 1.	ch 9	(9)
Round 2.	sc in second ch from hook, 6 sc, 3 sc in last ch. Continue on the other side of beginning ch: 6 sc, 2 sc into the last ch (you made the first sc into this ch)	(18)
Round 3.	inc, 6 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc, 2 inc	(24)
Round 4.	(sc, inc), 6 sc, (sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (sc, inc) 2-times	(30)
Round 5.	(2 sc, inc), 6 sc, (2 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (2 sc, inc) 2-times	(36)
Round 6.	(3 sc, inc), 6 sc, (3 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (3 sc, inc) 2-times	(42)

- Round 7. - Round 12. sc\* (42)  
 Round 13. (3 sc, dec), 6 sc, (3 sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (3 sc, dec) 2-times (36)  
 Round 14. sc\* (36)  
 Round 15. (2 sc, dec), 6 sc, (2 sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (2 sc, dec) 2-times (30)

In next round mouth and head will be crocheted together. Please prepare the mouth and fold it in half.



- Round 16. 9 sc (insert hook through mouth and head stitches, as you see on the pictures above), 21 sc (30)  
 Round 17. 9 sc (insert hook through the remaining stitches of the mouth, see pictures below), 21 sc (30)



- Round 18. - Round 28. sc\* (30)

Start stuffing the head and keep on stuffing while crocheting.

- Round 29. (3 sc, dec)\* (24)

In next round you need to leave 2 small holes. The wire for Rambert's horns will be lead through them.

- Round 30. (2 sc, dec)3-times, (sc, ch2, skip 1, dec), (2 sc, dec), (sc, ch2, skip 1, dec) (20)

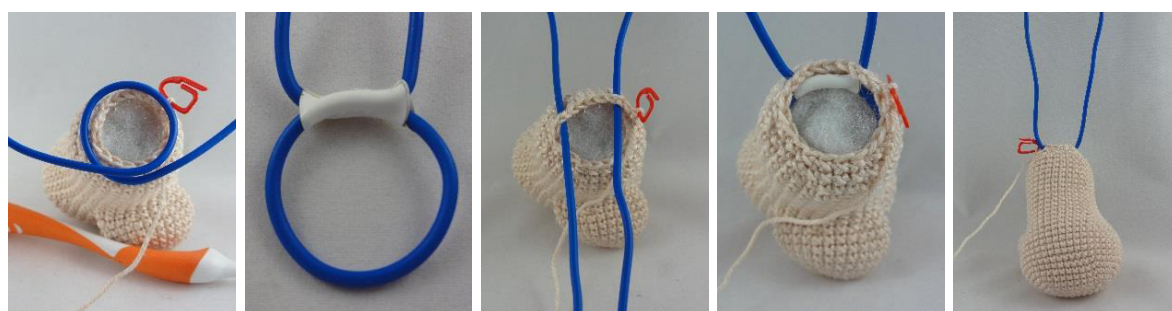




Round 31. 10 sc, sc into the 2 ch loop from previous round, 5 sc, sc into the 2 ch loop from previous round, sc (18)

Start to create the wire frame for Rambert's horns at this point. In my case the wire was approximately 60 cm long. Keep in mind the size of the hook and the gauge of the yarn you are using. You may want to leave the wire rather a bit longer. Adjust it to the final length, when the horns' size is evident.

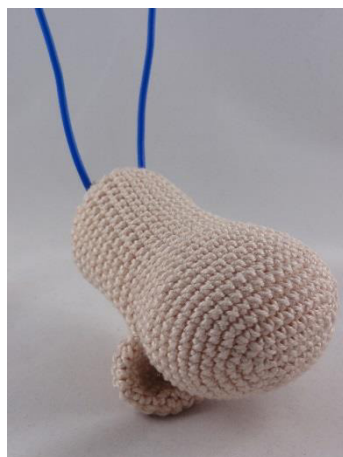
Make a loop in the middle of the wire. The loop should fit exactly into the head. Secure it with the rubber tape. Insert the wire into the head as you see on the picture. Stuff the head nicely around the wire.



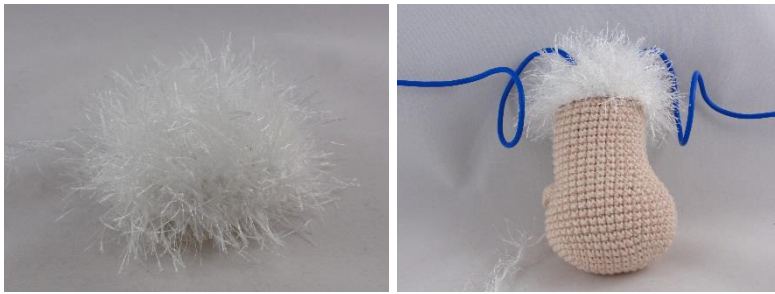
Round 32. (sc, dec)\* (12)

Round 33. dec\* (6)

FO. Close the hole by leading the thread through the front loops of last round, pull it tight and weave the yarn tail into the head.



## Hair



With white Brazilia yarn:

Round 1.	6 sc in double adjustable ring	(6)
Round 2.	inc*	(12)
Round 3.	(sc, inc)*	(18)
Round 4.	(2 sc, inc)*	(24)

In the next round the holes for the horns' wire will be created.

Round 5.	(ch2, skip 1, 2 sc, inc), (sc, ch2, skip 1, sc, inc), (3 sc, inc) 4-times	(32)
Round 6.	(sc into the 2 ch loop from previous round, 3 sc, inc), (sc, sc into the 2 ch loop from previous round, 2 sc, inc), (4 sc, inc) 4-times	(36)
Round 7.	- Round 10. sc*	(36)

FO; leave a long yarn tail for sewing it to the head. Place the hair on the head, lead the horns' wire through the holes created in Round 5. With invisible stitches sew the hair to the head.

## Eyes



Eyeballs with white yarn (make 2):

- Round 1. ch 4 (4)  
Round 2. sc in second ch from hook, sc, 3 sc in last ch. Continue on the other side of beginning ch: sc, 2 sc into the last ch (you made the first sc into this ch) (8)  
Round 3. inc, sc, 3 inc, sc, 2 inc (14)  
Round 4. (sc, inc), sc, (sc, inc) 3-times, sc, (sc, inc) 2-times (20)  
Round 5. sc\* (20)

FO. Leave a long yarn tail for sewing it to the head.

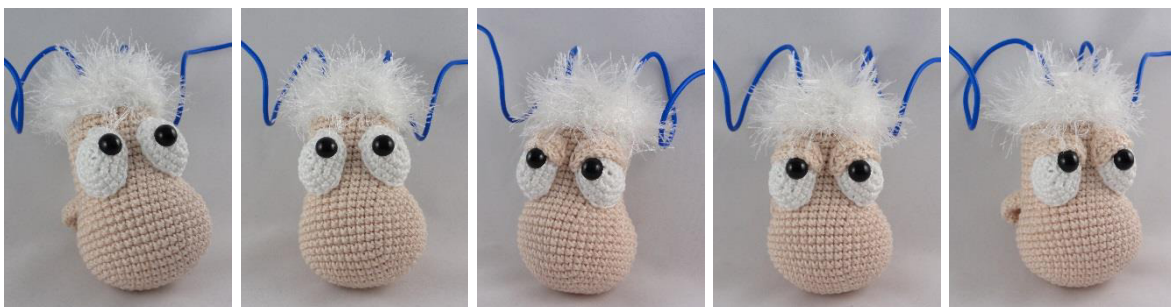
Eyelids with beige yarn (make 2):

Eyelids are crocheted in rows.

- Row 1. ch10 (10)  
Row 2. Starting at second ch from hook 9 sc, turn (9)  
Row 3. dec, 5 sc, dec, turn (7)  
Row 4. 3 dec, slst, DO NOT TURN!

Slst around. FO. Leave a long yarn tail for sewing it to the head.

Insert the black safety eyes into the eyeballs (see pictures above). With invisible stitches sew the eyes to the head. For the exact place see the pictures below. Stuff the eyes softly with a small amount of filling while sewing. Sew the eyelids onto the eyeballs.



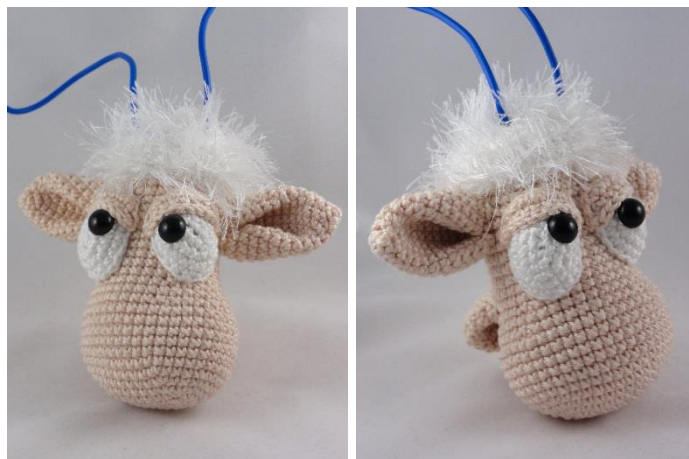
## Ears



With beige yarn:

Round 1.	3 sc in double adjustable ring	(3)
Round 2.	inc*	(6)
Round 3.	(sc, inc)*	(9)
Round 4.	(2 sc, inc)*	(12)
Round 5.	(3 sc, inc)*	(15)
Round 6.	(4 sc, inc)*	(18)
Round 7.	(5 sc, inc)*	(21)
Round 8.	(6 sc, inc)*	(24)
Round 9.	- Round 13. sc*	(24)

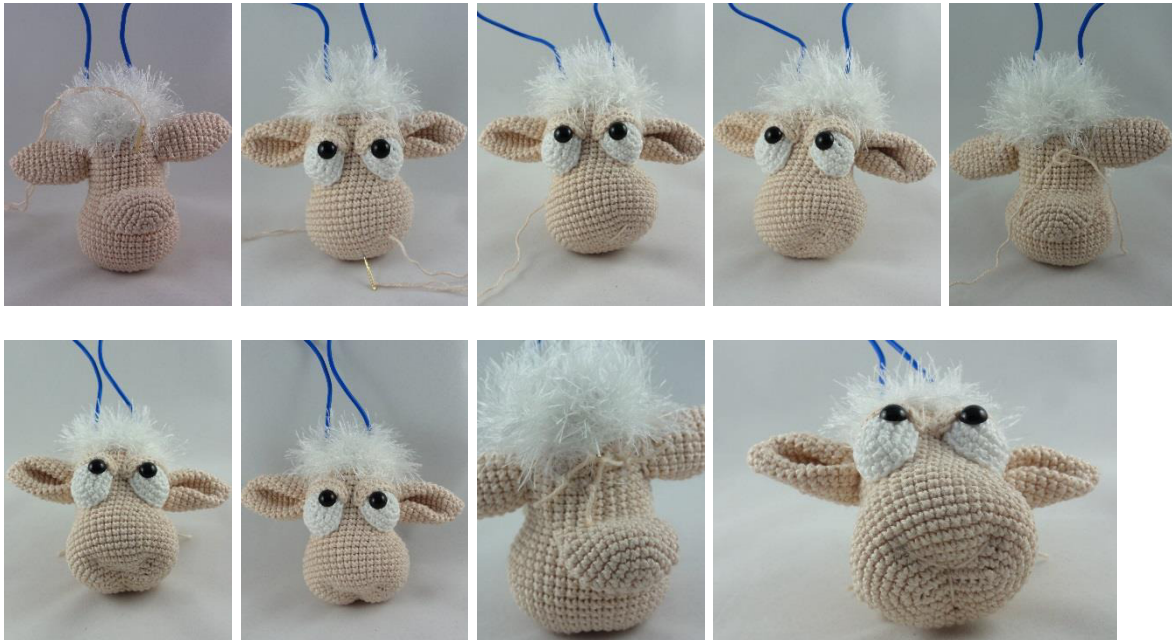
FO; leave a long yarn tail. Flatten the ears and fold back about a quarter on each side (see pictures above). With invisible stitches sew it to the head. See the pictures for the exact place.





## Nose

With beige yarn embroider the nose of Rambert. The nose is formed by 3 big stitches. For the exact place and position of the stitches see the pictures below. The stitches are pulled tight and fixed by a knot at the back side of the head.



## Horns



With dark grey yarn (make 2):

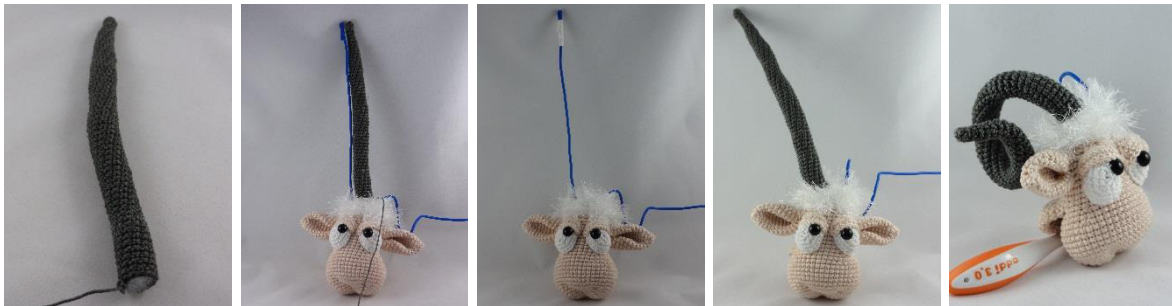

Start stuffing the horn softly and keep on stuffing as you go on.

- Round 18. inc, 8 sc (10)  
 Round 19. - Round 28. sc\* (10)  
 Round 29. inc, 9 sc (11)  
 Round 30. - Round 49. sc\* (11)  
 Round 50. inc, 10 sc (12)  
 Round 51. - Round 59. sc\* (12)

FO. Leave a long yarn tail for sewing it to the head.



Cut the horn's wire to the exact size. In my case approximately 20 cm. Fold back the very end as you see on the pictures above and fix it with rubber tape. Insert the wire into the horn and with invisible stitches sew the horn to the head. Bend the horn to the proper form and position.

## Body



With white Brazilia yarn:

Round 1.	ch 9	(9)
Round 2.	sc in second ch from hook, 6 sc, 3 sc in last ch. Continue on the other side of beginning ch: 6 sc, 2 sc into the last ch (you made the first sc into this ch)	(18)
Round 3.	inc, 6 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc, 2 inc	(24)
Round 4.	(sc, inc), 6 sc, (sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (sc, inc) 2-times	(30)
Round 5.	(2 sc, inc), 6 sc, (2 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (2 sc, inc) 2-times	(36)
Round 6.	(3 sc, inc), 6 sc, (3 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (3 sc, inc) 2-times	(42)
Round 7.	(4 sc, inc), 6 sc, (4 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (4 sc, inc) 2-times	(48)
Round 8.	(5 sc, inc), 6 sc, (5 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (5 sc, inc) 2-times	(54)
Round 9.	(6 sc, inc), 6 sc, (6 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (6 sc, inc) 2-times	(60)
Round 10.	sc*	(60)
Round 11.	(7 sc, inc), 6 sc, (7 sc, inc) 3-times, 6 sc, (7 sc, inc) 2-times	(66)
Round 12.	- Round 26. sc*	(66)
Round 27.	13 sc, (9 sc, dec) 3-times, 20 sc	(63)
Round 28.	13 sc, (8 sc, dec) 3-times, 20 sc	(60)
Round 29.	13 sc, (7 sc, dec) 3-times, 20 sc	(57)
Round 30.	13 sc, (6 sc, dec) 3-times, 20 sc	(54)
Round 31.	(5 sc, dec), 6 sc, (5 sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (5 sc, dec) 2-times	(48)
Round 32.	(4 sc, dec), 6 sc, (4 sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (4 sc, dec) 2-times	(42)
Round 33.	(3 sc, dec), 6 sc, (3 sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (3 sc, dec) 2-times	(36)
Round 34.	(2 sc, dec), 6 sc, (2 sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (2 sc, dec) 2-times	(30)

Take a pebble and place it into the body. It will help to stabilize the ready figure. Stuff the body. Stuff it nicely around the pebble. Take care to keep the pebble in proper position (more in the belly - bottom area) while stuffing.



Round 35. (sc, dec), 6 sc, (sc, dec) 3-times, 6 sc, (sc, dec) 2-times (24)

Round 36. - Round 39. sc\* (24)

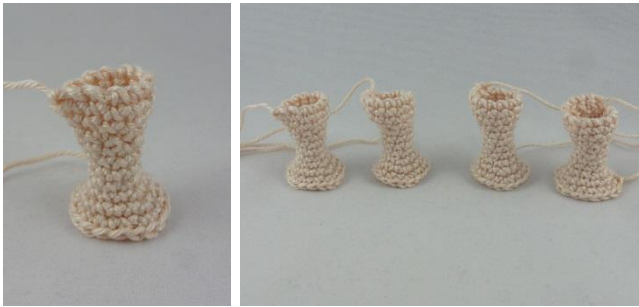
FO. Leave a long yarn tail. Finish stuffing of the body. With invisible stitches sew the body to the head.



## Feet and legs



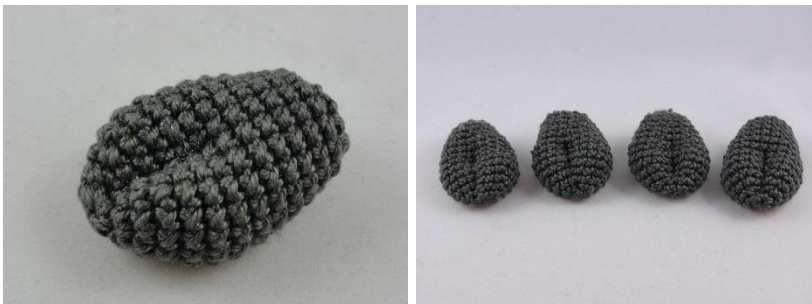
Legs with beige yarn (make 4):

FO. Leave a long yarn tail for sewing it to the feet.

Feet with dark grey yarn (make 4):

Round 5.	(3 sc, inc)3-times, 9 sc	(24)
Round 6.	- Round 7. sc*	(24)
Round 8.	(3 sc, dec)3-times, 9 sc	(21)
Round 9.	sc*	(21)
Round 10.	(2 sc, dec)3-times, 9 sc	(18)
Round 11.	sc*	(18)
Round 12.	(sc, dec)3-times, 9 sc	(15)
Round 13.	sc*	(15)

Stuff the foot.

Round 14.	(3 sc, dec)*	(12)
Round 15.	dec*	(6)

FO. Close the hole by leading the thread through the front loops of last round, pull it tight and weave the yarn tail into the foot. With a few invisible stitches create the cloven hoofs on the foot (see pictures).



Sew the leg with invisible stitches to the foot. Stuff the legs and with invisible stitches sew them to the body as you see on the picture. Try to find the proper position of the feet in order to improve Rambert's balance.



## Tail



With white Brazilia yarn:

Round 1.	6 sc in double adjustable ring	(6)
Round 2.	inc*	(12)
Round 3.	(sc, inc)*	(18)
Round 4.	- Round 9. sc*	(18)
Round 10.	(sc, dec)*	(12)

FO. Leave a long yarn tail. Stuff the tail softly. Flatten the opening and with invisible stitches sew the tail to the body. For exact place and position see pictures below.
