YOU WILL NEED

- Yarn of your choice in colors: off-white, beige, turquoise, mustard yellow, dark gray, khaki, black, brown and one color of your choice for the skin (in the pattern we will call it color A);
- Embroidery floss for decorating the faces;
- Crochet hook suitable for the yarn of your choice;
- Two pairs of store bought doll glasses or a piece of crafting wire to make eyewear (optional);
- Toy stuffing;
- Needles, pins, stitch markers;
- Water soluble marker, pliers (optional).

Go with your gut feeling when choosing materials for your project, but we would recommend to do it within the same brand, so the yarns have similar characteristics and proportions of the toys are preserved.

ZOE, THE GRANDMA

Construction: Legs and body are worked together in one piece from bottom to top. Head, hair, boobies, skirt, cardy, arms, nose and ears are sewn to the main part. The shoes are removable.

HEAD

In color A.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- 2. inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- 4. sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)
- **5.** [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)
- **6**. 2 sc, [inc, 4 sc] x 5, inc, 2 sc (36)
- 7. [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)
- **8.** 3 sc, [inc, 6 sc] x 5, inc, 3 sc (48)
- **9.** [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)
- **10.** 4 sc, [inc, 8 sc] x 5, inc, 4 sc (60)
- **11-22.** (12 rounds). sc in every st (60)
- **23.** 4 sc, [dec, 8 sc] x 5, dec, 4 sc (54)
- **24.** [7 sc, dec] x 6 (48)
- **25.** 3 sc, [dec, 6 sc] x 5, dec, 3 sc (42)
- **26.** [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

Start gradually stuffing the head.

- **27.** 2 sc, [dec, 4 sc] x 5, dec, 2 sc (30)
- **28.** [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24)
- **29.** sc, [dec, 2 sc] x 5, dec, sc (18)

Before working the last round, make sure the head is stuffed very firmly. Pay attention to its poles: they shouldn't be flat, the head should be spherical, with no palpable lumps and holes in it.

30. [sc, dec] x 6 (12)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn. Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each of the twelve stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the end.

BODY

Start with the legs. Stuff as you go.

LEG₁

Start in color A.

- 1. 7 sc in a MR (7)
- **2.** inc x 7 (14)
- **3-12.** (10 rounds). sc in every st (14)

Change to off-white.

13-15. (3 rounds). sc in every st (14) *Fasten off, cut the yarn*.

LEG₂

Repeat rounds 1-15 of the 1st leg, but don't cut the yarn.

16. Ch 10, join leg 1 with a slst, 13 sc around leg 1, 10 sc along the chain, 14 sc around leg 2, 10 sc along the other side of the chain.







How to join the legs. Colors are illustrative.

Make additional 7 sc to move the beginning of the round to the side of the body (48)

17-21. (5 rounds). sc in every st (48)

22. [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

23. sc in every st (54)

24. [8 sc, inc] x 6 (60)

25-28. (4 rounds). sc in every st (60)

29. [8 sc, dec] x 6 (54)

30. sc in every st (54)

31. [7 sc, dec] x 6 (48)

32. sc in every st (48)

33. [6 sc, dec] x 6 (42)

Change to turquoise.

34. sc in every st (42)

35. sc blo in every st (42)

36. [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

37-40. (4 rounds). sc in every st (36)

Change to color A.

41. sc blo in every st (36)

42. sc in every st (36)

43. [4 sc, dec] x 6 (30)

44. sc in every st (30)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

Make sure the body is stuffed very firmly. Sew the head to the body neatly using a strand of the color A yarn.



SKIRT

Start in turquoise.

1. Ch 42; make sure the chain isn't twisted, join with a slst. Sc in every ch (42)

2. 3 sc, [inc, 6 sc] x 5, inc, 3 sc (48)

3. [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

4. 4 sc, [inc, 8 sc] x **5**, inc, 4 sc (60)

5. [9 sc, inc] x 6 (66)

6. 5 sc, [inc, 10 sc] x 5, inc, 5 sc (72)

7-20. (14 rounds). sc in every st (72)

Change to off-white.

21. Work this round in blo. [slst, skip 1 st, 5 hdc in the same st, skip 1 st] x 18 (72)

Make a slst to join and fasten off, cut the yarn, hide the end on the wrong side of the skirt. Using a strand of the turquoise yarn, sew the skirt, loop to loop, to the 35th round of the body.

BOOBIES

Start in turquoise.

1. Ch 15, 13 sc starting from the 2nd ch from the hook, 3 sc in the bottom ch; don't turn your work, crochet along the other side of the chain: 12 sc, inc (30)

2-5. (4 rounds). sc in every st (30)

Change to color A.

6. 25 sc blo, dec x 2, sc (28)

7-10. (4 rounds). sc in every st (28)

*The last st should be exactly at one side of the boobies. If it's not, add or undo some sts.

Stuff this part lightly if desired (we didn't).

Sew the boobies to the unworked front loops of the 41st round of the body neatly using a strand of the color A yarn.









CARDY

Granny's cardigan is essentially a simple cape; it's not supposed to come off. The arms will be sewn on top of it.

In mustard yellow. Work in rows.

- 1. Ch 28; starting from the 3rd ch from the hook, 4 hdc, 4 sc, 6 hdc, 12 dc, ch 2, turn (26)
- 2. dc, 11 dc blo, 6 hdc blo, 4 sc blo, 3 hdc blo, hdc, ch 2, turn (26)
- **3.** hdc, 3 hdc blo, 4 sc blo, 6 hdc blo, 11 dc blo, dc, ch 2, turn (26)
- **4-24.** (21 rows) repeat instructions for rows 2, 3.
- **25.** hdc, 3 hdc blo, 4 sc blo, 6 hdc blo, 11 dc blo, dc (26)

Check if the cardy is wide enough; crochet a couple more rows if needed.

Fasten off, cut the yarn, hide the end on the wrong side of the cardy.

Wrap the cardy around doll's body; the narrow part is the neckline. Using a tapestry needle, secure it in the proper position with a couple of stitches.

ARMS (x 2)

Start in color A.

- **1.** 5 sc in a MR (5)
- **2.** inc x 5 (10)
- **3.** 4 sc, bobble st, 5 sc (10)
- **4-7.** (4 rounds) sc in every st (10)

Change to mustard yellow.

8-23. (16 rounds) sc in every st (10)

*NOTE: When finishing the arm, fold the arm in half. Having the finger on one side of the arm, the last stitch of round 23 should be exactly on the opposite side. If it's not, add or undo stitches if it's necessary.

Fasten off leaving a long tail to sew it to the body. Stuff the arms halfway so they don't stick out too much after sewing. Sew the arms on both sides of the body on top of the cardy, just under the collar.

HAIR

Granny's hair consists of four parts: the back part, two front parts and the bun.

BACK PART

In beige.

- 1.6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2.** inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- **4.** sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)
- **5.** [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)
- **6.** 2 sc, [inc, 4 sc] x 5, inc, 2 sc (36)
- 7. [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)
- **8.** 3 sc, [inc, 6 sc] x 5, inc, 3 sc (48)
- **9.** [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

- **10.** 4 sc, [inc, 8 sc] x 5, inc, 4 sc (60)
- **11.** [19 sc, inc] x 3 (63)
- **12-19.** (8 rounds) sc in every st (63)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

In beige.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- 2. inc x 6 (12)
- 3. $[sc, inc] \times 6 (18)$
- **4.** sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)
- **5.** [7 sc, inc] x 3 (27)
- **6.** 4 sc, [inc, 8 sc] x 2, inc, 4 sc (30)
- 7. [9 sc, inc] x 3 (33)
- **8.** 5 sc, [inc, 10 sc] x 2, inc, 5 sc (36)
- **9-11.** (3 rounds). sc in every st (36)
- **12.** 5 sc, [dec, 10 sc] x 2, dec, 5 sc (33)
- **13-14.** sc in every st (33)
- **15.** [9 sc, dec] x 3 (30)
- **16-17.** sc in every st (30)

In beige.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- 2. inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- 4. sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)
- **5.** [7 sc, inc] x 3 (27)
- **6.** 4 sc, [inc, 8 sc] x 2, inc, 4 sc (30)
- **7.** sc in every st (30)
- **8.** 4 sc, [dec, 8 sc] x 2, dec, 4 sc (27)
- **9.** sc in every st (27)
- **10.** [7 sc, dec] x 3 (24)
- 11-13. (3 rounds). sc in every st (24)
- **14.** 3 sc, [dec, 6 sc] x 2, dec, 3 sc (21)
- **15-16.** sc in every st (21)
- **17.** [5 sc, dec] x 3 (18)
- **18.** sc in every st (18)
- **19.** 2 sc, [dec, 4 sc] x 2, dec, 2 sc (15)
- **20.** sc in every st (15)
- **21.** [3 sc, dec] x 3 (12)
- **22.** sc in every st (12)
- **23.** [2 sc, dec] x 3 (9)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

BUN

In beige.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2.** inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- **4.** sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)

- **5.** [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)
- **6-10.** (5 rounds). sc in every st (30)
- **11.** [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24)
- **12.** [2 sc, dec] x 6 (18)

Fasten off, cut the yarn. Stuff the bun firmly; the other hair parts don't need to be stuffed.

Put the "hat" onto the back of the head at the 45° angle, sew it using a strand of the beige yarn.

Flatten the front parts of the head, they should look like flower petals. Try them on the forehead, slightly overlapping each other, play around with them. Once you find the proper position, secure the parts with pins and sew them to the head neatly. You may want to put a tiny bit of stuffing under the bigger part to make the hair more voluminous.

Sew the bun on top of the back part of the head; light asymmetry will make the hairdo more picturesque. Embroider some white lines on the hair, if desired (a water soluble marker might come handy). See images on next page.

NOSE

In color A.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2-7.** (6 rounds). sc in every st (6)


*Crochet 2 rounds for the short nose or 6 rounds for the hooked one.

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

If you chose the short option, sew the nose in the center of the face, 3-4 rounds below the edge of the hair. If you chose the hooked nose, sew it right under the hair, so its upper part is slightly overlapped by the "fringe". See pictures for reference.









EARS (x 2)

In color A.

9 sc in a MR. Pull tight, cut the yarn leaving a tail for sewing.

Sew the ears on both sides of the head, just right under the hair.

SHOES (x 2)

In brown.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2.** inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- **4.** [2 sc, inc] x 6 (24)
- **5.** sc in every st (24)
- **6.** 6 sc, dec x 6, 6 sc (18)
- 7. 7 sc, dec x 2, 7 sc (16)
- **8-10.** (3 rounds) sc in every st (16)

Make a slst, fasten off and weave in the end.

number of the sc stitches in r.16 so that the handle is centered (stitch markers could be helpful). In this case, you will also have to adjust the number of sl sts in r. 17.

16. 4 sc, 9 ch, skip 9 sts, 8 sc, 9 ch, skip 9 sts, 4 sc

17. 4 slst, 10 sc (by passing the crochet hook under the chain, the stitches must "wrap" the chain), 8 sl st, 10 sc (by passing the crochet hook under the chain), 4 sl st.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

Embroider the nose (use the embroidery needle) with a French knot stitch in the middle of the 10th round, and two straight stitches to make the mouth.

Embroider the eyes with straight stitches between rnds 9-11, and the cheeks below the eyes (use the image as a guide).

CRAFTING BAG

Start in beige.

Ch 14. Crochet around the chain. Starting from the 2nd ch from hook:

- **1.** 12 sc, 3 sc in last ch. Continue crocheting in the other side: 11 sc, inc (28)
- 2. inc, 11 sc, inc x 3, 11 sc, inc x 2 (34)
- 3. 34 sc blo (34)
- **4-14.** (11 rounds). sc in every st (34)

Change to light brown.

15. sc in every st (34)*

*NOTE: Depending on your way of crocheting, you may have to adjust the





- **-Embroider the eyes, eyebrows, cheeks and mouth** using scraps of yarn or embroidery floss in different colors. A water soluble marker or sewing pins may come handy to mark out their positions first.
- -Put the glasses on granny's nose. Find the instruction on making glasses on page 21.
- -Put the shoes on.
- **-Give her some cute little accessories** (hairpins, a brooch) to make the toy your very own.

Construction: Legs and body are worked together in one piece from bottom to top. Head, beard, mustache, nose, ears, sweater ribbing and arms are sewn to the main part. The shoes are removable.

HEAD

In color A.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2.** inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- **4.** sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)
- **5.** [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)
- **6.** 2 sc, [inc, 4 sc] x 5, inc, 2 sc (36)
- 7. [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)
- **8.** 3 sc, [inc, 6 sc] x 5, inc, 3 sc (48)
- **9.** [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)
- **10-22.** (13 rounds). sc in every st (54)
- **23.** 21 sc blo*, 33 sc (54)

*this will be the base for sewing the beard.

- **24-27.** (4 rounds). sc in every st (54)
- **28.** [7 sc, dec] x 6 (48)
- **29.** 3 sc, [dec, 6 sc] x 5, dec, 3 sc (42)
- **30.** [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

Start gradually stuffing the head.

- **31.** 2 sc, [dec, 4 sc] x 5, dec, 2 sc (30)
- **32.** [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24)
- **33.** sc, [dec, 2 sc] x 5, dec, sc (18)

Before working the last round, make sure the head is stuffed very firmly. Pay attention to its poles: they shouldn't be flat, the head should be spherical, with no palpable lumps and holes in it.

34. [sc, dec] x 6 (12)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn. Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each of the twelve stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the end.

BODY

Start with the legs. Stuff as you go.

LEG₁

Start in dark gray.

- 1. 7 sc in a MR (7)
- **2.** inc x 7 (14)
- **3-15.** (13 rounds). sc in every st (14)
- **16.** [sc, inc] x 7 (21)
- 17. [2 sc, inc] x 7 (28)
- **18.** [3 sc, inc] x 7 (35)
- **19-21.** (3 rounds). sc in every st (35)

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing the legs together.

LEG 2

Repeat rounds 1-21 of the 1st leg, but don't cut the yarn. Place a stitch marker in the last stitch you made.

22. 29 sc along the 2nd leg, sc in the 1st leg, 29 sc along the 1st leg, sc in the st where the marker is. You just joined the legs together. Keep working on the body. (60)

23-25. (3 rounds). sc in every st (60)

Using the yarn tail you left at the end of making the 1st leg, sew the gap between the legs closed. *Stuff the legs firmly*.

26-30. (5 rounds) sc in every st (60)

Change to khaki. Start gradually stuffing the body.

31. sc in every st (60)

32. blo [9 sc, inc] x 6 (66)

33-37. (5 rounds) sc in every st (66)

38. [9 sc, dec] x 6 (60)

39-50. (12 rounds). sc in every st (60)

51. 4 sc, [dec, 8 sc] x 5, dec, 4 sc (54)

52. [7 sc, dec] x 6 (48)

53. 3 sc, [dec, 6 sc] x 5, dec, 3 sc (42)

54. [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

Change to color A, but don't cut the khaki yarn just yet, bring it to front instead.

55. blo sc in every st (36)

56. [4 sc, dec] x 6 (30)

57. sc in every st (30)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

Go back to round 55 and the khaki yarn. Hdc in every unworked fl of the round: this will be the sweater collar (the hdc stitches are worked in the same direction as the rest of the body). Make a slst, fasten off, cut the yarn and weave in the end.

Make sure the body is stuffed very firmly.

Secure the head onto the body with pins; don't forget that the unworked loops of the





23rd round of the head should be on the face! Sew the head to the body neatly. Before making the last stitches, add more stuffing in the neck area using a bamboo skewer.

SWEATER RIBBING

In khaki. Crochet in rows.

- 1. Ch 7; 5 hdc starting from the 3rd ch from the hook, ch 2, turn.
- 2. hdc, 3 hdc blo, hdc, ch 2, turn
- **3-40.** (38 rows). repeat instruction for row 2.

Try the piece on; make sure it fits the body nicely. Do or undo a couple of rows if needed.

Fold the work in half and crochet 5 slst along the short side through both thicknesses. Fasten off, cut the yarn, hide the tail on the wrong side of the work. Put the ribbing onto the body. Using a strand of the khaki yarn, sew it to the unworked loops of the 32nd round of the body neatly.

ARMS (x 2)

Start in color A.

- 1. 5 sc in a MR (5)
- 2. inc x 5 (10)
- **3.** 4 sc, bobble st, 5 sc (10)
- **4-7.** (4 rounds) sc in every st (10)

Change to khaki.

8-30. (23 rounds) sc in every st (10)

*NOTE: When finishing the arm, fold the arm in half. Having the finger on one side of the arm, the last stitch of round 30 should be exactly on the opposite side. If it's not, add or undo stitches if it's necessary.

Fasten off leaving a long tail to sew it to the body. Stuff the arms halfway so they don't stick out too much after sewing. Sew the arms on both sides of the body, just under the collar.

SHOES (x2)

In black.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2.** inc x 6 (12)
- **3.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- 4. [2 sc, inc] x 6 (24)
- **5.** sc in every st (24)
- **6.** 6 sc, dec x 6, 6 sc (18)
- 7. 7 sc, dec x 2, 7 sc (16)
- **8-10.** (3 rounds) sc in every st (16)

Make a slst, fasten off and weave in the end.

BEARD

In beige.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2.** [sc, inc] x 3 (9)
- **3.** [2 sc, inc] x 3 (12)
- **4.** [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
- **5.** sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 5, inc, sc (24)
- **6.** [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)
- **7.** sc in every st (30)
- **8.** 2 sc, [inc, 4 sc] x 5, inc, 2 sc (36)
- **9.** sc in every st (36)
- **10.** [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)
- **11-21.** (11 rounds)*. sc in every st (42)

*Crochet as many rounds as you want to make the beard shorter or longer than the one you see in the photos in pages 20-22.

Don't stuff. Flatten the work, ch 1, sc 21 through both thicknesses. Fasten off, cut the yarn leaving a tail for sewing. Sew the beard to the unworked loops of the round 23 of the head.

- **3.** [sc, inc] x 3 (9)
- **4.** sc in every st (9)
- **5.** [2 sc, inc] x 3 (12)

- **10.** [3 sc, dec] x 3 (12)
- **11.** sc in every st (12)

NOSE

In color A.

- 1. 6 sc in a MR (6)
- **2-7.** (6 rounds). sc in every st (6)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

Sew the nose in the center of the face, the tip of the nose is supposed to be on the same level as the lower edge of mustache.

EARS (x 2)

In color A.

9 sc in a MR. Pull tight, cut the yarn leaving a tail for sewing.

Sew the ears on both sides of the head.



FINISHING TOUCHES


- **-Embroider the eyes and eyebrows** using scraps of beige yarn or embroidery floss. A water soluble marker or sewing pins may come handy to mark out their positions first. *See images on next page*.
- **-Embroider some hair** on the back of the head.
- **-Put the glasses on grandpa's nose.** Find the instruction for making glasses on page 23.
- -Put the shoes on.
- **-Give him some personality** by adding some little details.

















YOU CAN MAKE YOUR OWN GLASSES!

To make the glasses, wrap a piece of crafting wire around a cylindrical object of the desired size (we used the handle of a wooden spoon). Skip a section equal to the distance between the eyes and make a wrap again. Using pliers, bend the wire 90° to make the sidepieces. Cut the excess wire off.
