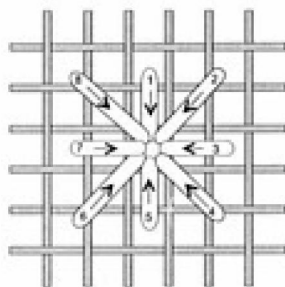
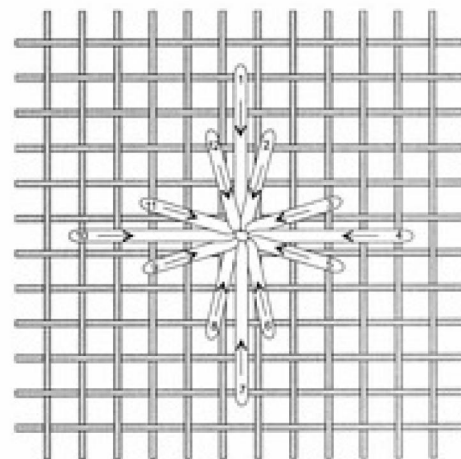


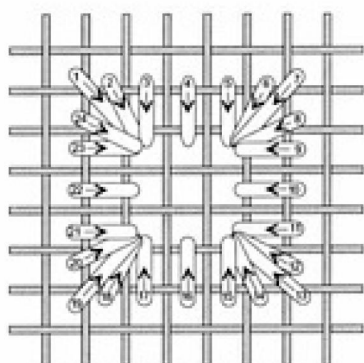
A. Round Eyelet



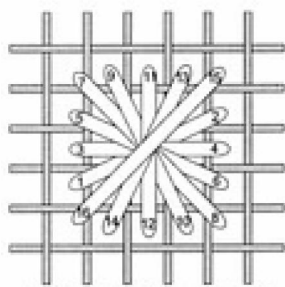
B. Algerian Eyelet



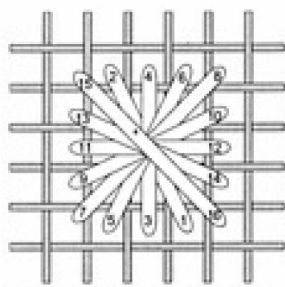
C. Diamond Eyelet Variation



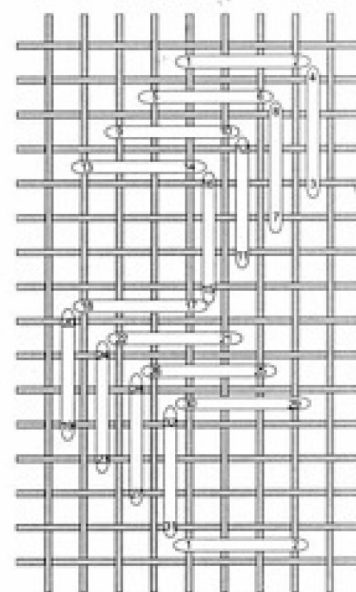
D. Double Cross Eyelet



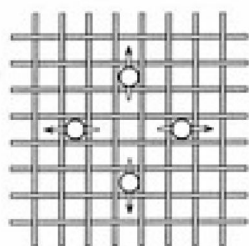
E. Rhodes Square Left



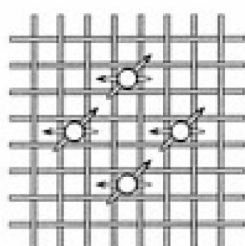
E. Rhodes Square Right



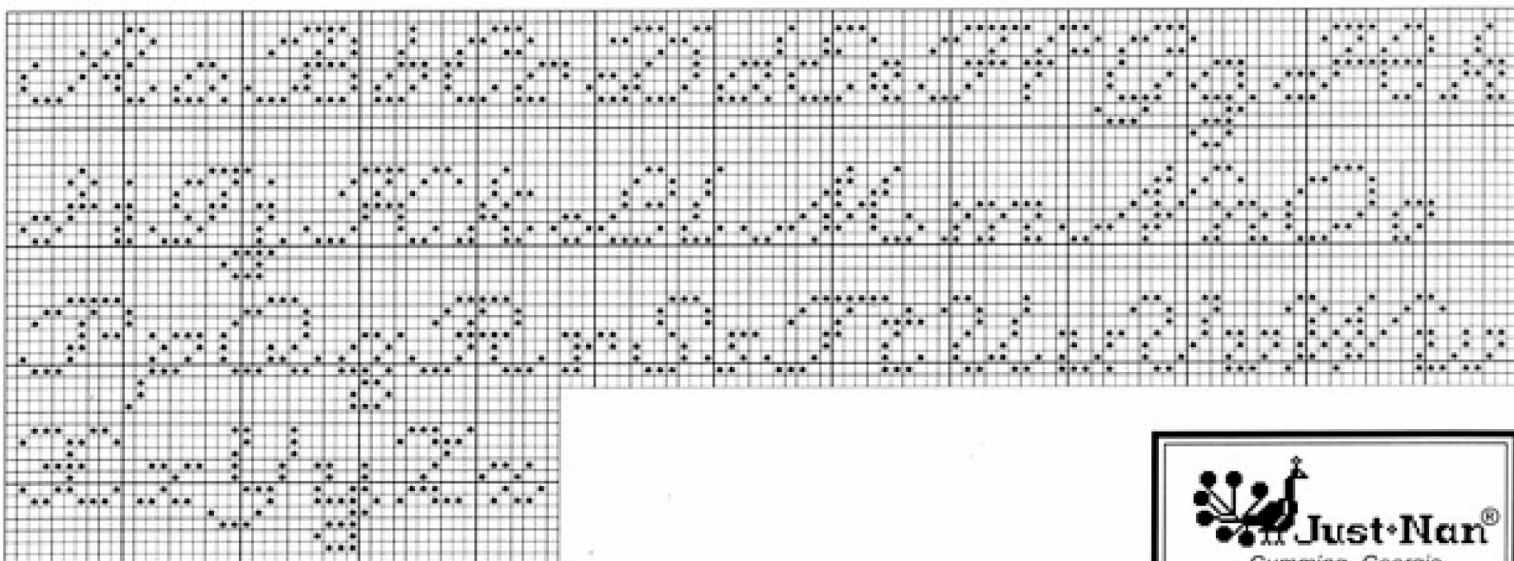

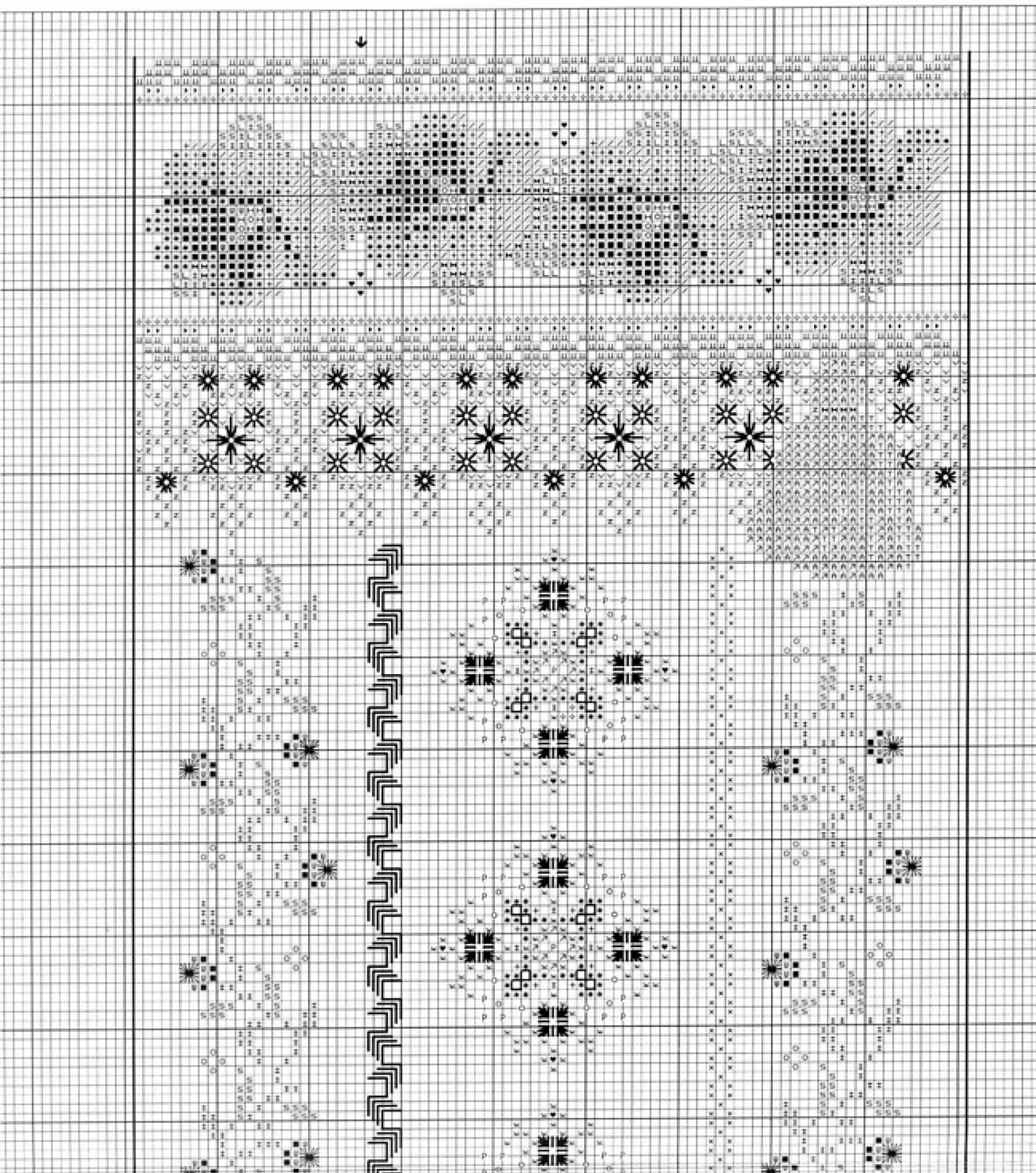

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS: This sampler is designed for linen or other evenweave fabrics. Allow an extra 3" on all sides of the design area when cutting fabric. Color numbers are given for both DMC and Anchor floss. The instructions list the DMC numbers first and the Anchor numbers in parentheses. Use 2 strands of floss for cross stitches. If the symbol indicates 2 colors, use 1 strand of each in your needle. Where the design calls for perle cotton or #4 Braid, use 1 strand as it comes off the ball or reel. Refer to the instructions below for the thread and number of strands used in special stitches.

BEADS: The Just Nan Embellishments pack for *Burgundy Bouquet* contains all the beads and pearls needed for the stocking and one ornament. Attach all beads with a beading needle and 1 strand of Ecu (387) floss. Go through each bead twice.

GETTING STARTED: The middle of the stocking design is marked with a small arrow. Find the middle of your fabric, measure down 3" (or the number of inches you have allowed for extra fabric), then count back 44 threads to the left. Begin stitching the top row of the stocking cuff. Work all cross stitches, then add special stitches and beads. **Refer to the stitch graph for placement of all special stitches.**

Diag. A: Round Eyelet. Work 17 Round Eyelets in the lace below the cuff using 1 strand #12 perle Ecu. Pull each leg to open the center.

Diag. B: Algerian Eyelet. Work 22 Algerian Eyelets in the lace below the cuff using 1 strand #12 perle Ecu. Pull each leg to open the center.

Diag. C: Diamond Eyelet Variation. Work 5 of these eyelets in the lace below the cuff using 1 strand #12 perle Ecu. Pull each leg to open the center.

Diag. D: Double Cross Eyelet. Work 4 of these eyelets in each of the five motifs down the center of the stocking. Use 1 strand #12 perle Ecu, pulling each leg to create the double cross effect.

Diag. E: Rhodes Square. Work one Rhodes Square in each of the flowers in the vine pattern running down each side of the stocking. Use 2 strands of 316 (2 of 1017). *Note: Use the Left Rhodes diagram for the flowers to the left of the vine and the Right Rhodes diagram for the flowers to the right of the vine.*

Diag. F: Geometric Satin. Work in the vertical band to the left of the center motifs. Use 1 strand #12 perle Ecu.

Diag. G: Red Beads. Use this diagram to attach the Red Plum bead groups in the cuff and toe.

Diag. H: Gold Beads. Use this diagram to attach the Metallic Gold bead groups in the vine patterns.

Backstitches: Use 1 strand 002 #4 Braid for the small square outlines in each of the motifs down the center of the stocking.

Use the solid line around the stocking as a guide for the shape.

Name Tag: Personalize your stocking by adding a name tag. Use the alphabet provided to graph the name you wish to stitch. Add floral motifs on each side of the name using the sample graph at the bottom of the stocking. For the model I used 32 count Cream Belfast Linen. If your name is very long you may want to use 36 count linen or consider using initials.
