

Pretty Daisy

Crochet pattern





To crochet the daisy doll, the potted flower and the little duck

Materials: (this pattern uses American standard abbreviations)

For the doll and accessories:

- Several different colored yarns suitable for a n°2,5/3 crochet (for the doll, clothes and accessories)
- Fluffy yarn (mohair or brush style) for the hair
- 2,00 mm or 2,25 mm crochet hook (depending on your tension)
- 3,00 mm crochet hook for the hair
- Thin metal wire (eg. florist wire) of about 40 cm length for the headband
- Needles for sewing
- A small amount of black yarn to embroider the eyes
- Polyester toy stuffing

The finished doll (using the materials listed) measures approximately 16 cm.

Stitches and abbreviations:

ch: chain stitch or chain space

sc : single crochetslst : slip stitch

hdc : half double crochetdc : double crochet

inc: increase (2 stitches into 1 stitch of previous round)


dec: decrease (crochet 2 stitches together)

bbl: bobble stitch (3 double crochet worked together in the same stitch)

BLO: working in back loop only

(...): repeat until end

Each piece is crocheted in a continuous spiral, not in joined rounds, starting off with a magic loop, unless instructed otherwise in the pattern.

At the end of each line, you will find the number of stitches you should have at the end of each round in parentheses. The legs, body and head are worked in a single piece (starting from the bottom). The arms are assembled afterwards. Please ensure that you stuff your doll firmly and evenly as you go.

Use a thin wooden stick to stuff smaller pieces.

Note: When changing color, change your yarn in the last step of the last stitch, meaning: Crochet the first step of your single crochet sc (first yarn over) with the original color (there are two loops on your hook) and finish your stitch (second yarn over) with the new color. The first stitch will still be the original color, the next stitch will be in the new color. Cut the old thread and make a knot.

The Daisy doll: 2 colors, Ivory (socks and body) and Almond (legs, head and hands)

Start with the legs: (in Ivory and Almond yarn)

1	5 sc in magic ring	(5)
2	inc (x5)	(10)
3	10 sc around	(10)
4	3 sc, 2 dec, 3 sc	(8)
5-7	8 sc around, 3 rounds Keep 30 cm of yarn to be able to crochet the cuff of the socks later on. Change color to Almond during the last yarn over. Leave the Ivory yarn hanging on the outside of your piece.	(8)
8	8 sc around in the back loop for this round	(8)
9-19	8 sc around, 11 rounds	(8)
	Continue with <u>3 or 4 sc</u> more to reach to the side of the leg and close with a slst.	

Stuff the legs as you go. Fasten off the 1st leg and cut the yarn.



Crochet the **second leg** the same way until (and including) the 19th round. Then proceed with **2 sc** to get to the joining of the legs. Change to the lvory color during the last yarn over and continue directly with the body.

The Body: To be worked directly after the 2nd leg with the Ivory color.

Stuff the body evenly as you go along.

Crochet <u>4 ch</u> on the end of the yarn of the second leg. Join to the first leg with 1 sc (counts as the first sc of the round), position legs slightly turned inwards.

1	8 sc (around the first leg), 4 sc (on the 4 chain stitches), 8 sc (around the second leg), 4 sc (on the 4 chain stitches)	(24)
2-8	Place a stitch marker here (start of new rounds) 24 sc around, 7 rounds	(24)
9	4 sc, dec (x4)	(20)
10	20 sc around	(20)
11	3 sc, dec (x4)	(16)
12	16 sc around	(16)
13	2 sc, dec (x4)	(12)
14	Crochet <u>9 sc</u> to get to the left side, then change to the Almond color during the last yarn over and move the stitch marker forward.	(12)
15	12 sc around, in the back loop for this round	(12)
16-17	12 sc around, 2 rounds	(12)



Continue immediately with the head. Do not cut the yarn.

The head: (in Almond)

1	inc (x12)	(24)
2	1 sc, inc (x12)	(36)
3	5 sc, inc (x6)	(42)
4	13 sc, inc <i>(x3)</i>	(45)
5-9	45 sc around, 5 rounds	(45)
10	13 sc, dec <i>(x3)</i>	(42)

Stuff well and evenly as you go along, especially in the neck and the base of the head.

11-14	42 sc around, 4 rounds	(42)
15	5 sc, dec (x6)	(36)
16	4 sc, dec (x6)	(30)
17	3 sc, dec (x6)	(24)
18	2 sc, dec (x6)	(18)
19	1 sc, dec (x6)	(12)
20	dec (x6)	(6)
19	1 sc, dec (x6)	(12



Finish stuffing the head, then sew the opening with a needle, weaving through the front loops. Tighten off and hide the yarn inside.

The sock cuffs: Use the Ivory yarn you left hanging on the socks and crochet in the front loops of round 8:

(1 sc in the first stitch, 1 slst in the next) x4 while holding the doll feet pointing up (8). Cut off the yarn and hide it inside.

The arms: (to be crocheted separately x2 - with Almond color)

1	6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2-3	6 sc around, 2 rounds	(6)
4	4 sc, dec	(5)
5-14	5 sc, around, 10 rounds	(5)

Do not stuff the arms.

Pinch the top of the arms and close the opening with 2 sc going through both layers at the same time.

Keep some yarn hanging so that you can sew the arms onto the body during round 15. Make the second arm identical.



The hair: (with fluffy yarn - here yarn Drops Kid-Silk col. 50 and 3 mm crochet hook).


Including a "wig" base and rolled up braids.

1	6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc (x6)	(12)
3	1 sc, inc (x6)	(18)
4	2 sc, inc (x6)	(24)
5	3 sc, inc (x6)	(30)
6	4 sc, inc (x6)	(36)
7	5 sc, inc (x6)	(42)
8	13 sc, inc (x3)	(45)
9-19	45 sc around, 11 rounds (the number of rounds can be adapted depending on the yarn you use or your style of crocheting)	(45)
20	22 sc, 1slst (middle of the forehead), 22 sc	(45)

Keep some yarn for the assembly.

Turn the wig inside out to bring out the "hairs" and brush them delicately with a small wire brush.

Fit the wig on the head and secure with pins.



Cut 24 strands of 25 cm length (12 strands for each braid). Fold the threads in half and, using your crochet, pass them through the stitches of the last round of the wig. To do this, locate a dozen stitches on each side of the head and pass the threads through each stitch. Fix them in pace by doing a noose knot, passing the ends through the loop.





Roll the strands slightly and form a braid on each side of the head. Secure them with a bit of yarn.

Roll the braids into a donut shape and sew them in place with a needle. Also sew the wig into place, following the edge of the last round. Cut and hide the remaining yarn tail. Tie a few extra strands on the forehead.


..... **Embroider the eyes** on round 7 with 8 stitches in between them.

Slightly color the checks with a piece of fabric (with red pencil scribbled on) to give rosy cheeks.



The Dress: (in Ivory and Pink yarn)

To be crocheted in rows and then in rounds.



Cut the yarn and close the round invisibly.

Crochet **the underskirt** with the pink yarn: attach the yarn on the first stitch of round 11, in the back loop.

13	1 ch, 42 hdc around	(42)
14	(1 sc + 3 ch) in each stitch	

End the round with 1 slst. Cut and hide the remaining yarn tail. At the neckline of the dress, add two little bits of yarn (or add a button and a loop) to close the dress.

The neckline : Crochet a chain of 26 stitches, *starting in the 3rd ch from the hook :* 2 hdc in each stitch.*

Cut the yarn off, leaving enough for sewing and weave it through the loop to secure it. Have the yarn come out at the top of the neckline and sew it into the front loops of round 2. Hide the yarn.









^{*} It is also possible to crochet it directly into the front loops of round 2.

The sandals: (in Beige and Pink yarn)

1	Beige 6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc (x6)	(12)
3	1 inc, 3 sc, 3 inc, 3 sc, 2 inc	(18)
4	18 sc around in the back loop for this round	(18)
5-6	Change to the Pink yarn 18 sc around, 2 rounds	(18)
7	5 sc, 4 dec, 5 sc	(14)
8	4 sc, 5 ch, skip 5 stitches, 5 sc	(14)

Fasten off. Cut and hide the remaining yarn tail. Crochet the second shoe in the exact same way.



The accessories: (the wings, the headband, the flower pot and the little duck)


The leafy wings: (in green yarn) - Make 2 of them

1	5 sc in a magic ring	(5)	
2	5 sc around	(5)	
3	inc (x5)	(10)	
4	1 sc, inc (x5)	(15)	
5	2 sc, inc (x5)	(20)	
6-8	20 sc around, 3 rounds	(20)	
9	2 sc, dec (x5)	(15)	
10	15 sc around	(15)	
11	3 hdc, (dec, 1 sc) x3, 3 hdc	(12)	


Pinch the opening (while folding the 6 hdc in half on one side to form the slant) and close with 6 sc going through both sides at the same time. Keep some of the yarn for the assembly.

With some dark green thread, embroider the leaf veins on both sides. Then sew the two leaves together at the base, the hdc will be at the bottom (see photo).

Create a chain of 50 ch to make <u>the straps</u>: Sew the middle point at the join of the wings, then at the bottom of the join.











The headband: (in Green, Yellow and Ivory yarn + thin metal wire of approximately 40 cm length)

Shape the metal wire into the shape of the headband with two 3 cm antennas, making sure it fits the head. (See photo above). Wrap the green yarn around the metal frame, while glueing in some spots to keep it secure.

The little flowers: (in Yellow and Ivory yarn) - Make two of them

In Yellow: Crochet 5 sc in a magic ring. Change to the Ivory color when you create the **1 slst** to close the ring.

In Ivory: Repeat x5 *2 ch, (3 dc worked together (to be worked like a popcorn stitch), 2 ch, 1 slst) in the same stitch* to create the 5 petals.



Pull on the yellow yarn to close the circle, make a knot with the two threads.

Also close off the Ivory yarn. Keep some Ivory yarn to sew the flowers onto the headband. Cut off the other threads.

Make the petals pop by bringing them to the front (the popcorn stitch tends to turn the other way round)

The back of the flowers: (in Ivory) - Make two of them

1	6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc (x6)	(12)



Close the ring with 1 slst and keep some yarn to sew them on the back of the flowers (see photo). Cut and hide the remaining yarn tail.

The potted flower: (in Copper and Brown yarn)

Start with the earth:

1	Brown 6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc (x6)	(12)
3	1 sc, inc <i>(x6)</i>	(18)
4	2 sc, inc <i>(x6)</i>	(24)
5	3 sc, inc <i>(x6)</i>	(30)

End the round with 1 slst, cut and hide the remaining yarn tail.



The pot:

1	Copper 6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc (x6)	(12)
3	1 sc, inc (x6)	(18)
4	2 sc, inc (x6)	(24)
5	24 sc around in the back loop	(24)
6	24 sc around	(24)
7	7 sc, inc (x3)	(27)
8	27 sc around	(27)
9	8 sc, inc (x3)	(30)
10-11	30 sc around, 2 rounds	(30)




Cut out a piece of cardboard into a circle with the same diameter as the base of the pot. Place it in the bottom and fill up with stuffing.

Without cutting the yarn, continue with the rim of the pot:

Place the earth circle on top of the pot and crochet **30 sc** around, going through both layers at the same time. Then **30 hdc** in the front loops. End the round with 1 slst, then cut and hide the remaining yarn tail.

Take the Copper yarn and crochet 24 slst in the front loops of round 5 to stabilize the base.

The Daisy: (in Yellow and Ivory yarn)



1	Yellow 5 sc in a magic ring	(5)
2	inc (x5)	(10)
3	10 sc around	(10)
4	10 slst around in the front loops	(10)

Change to the **Ivory** color while you are crocheting **1 slst** to close the ring. Continue immediately with **the petals** (in the back loops of round 4): [**5 ch** and starting from the 2nd ch from the hook crochet **3 sc**, **1 slst** along the chain, **1 slst** in the next stitch] x10 (10 petals in total).

Cut off the excess yarn and hide them inside the centre of the flower.

The back: (in Green)

1	5 sc in a magic ring	(5)
2	inc (x5)	(10)

Close the ring with 1 slst and keep some yarn for sewing.

The stem: (in Green + 8 cm length thin metal wire)

Crochet a chain of **11 ch** and starting from the 2nd ch from the hook: **10 sc** along the chain.

Keep some yarn for sewing. Fold the rectangle in two (vertically) and assemble the two sides while sliding half of the wire inside.

Sew the stem to the back of the flower, then add the green circle on top. Secure it with a few sewing stitches in the back loops of the center of the flower. Cut off the excess yarn and hide it inside.





The leaf: (in Green)

Crochet a chain of **8 ch** and starting from the 2nd ch from the hook : **1 slst**, **1 sc**, **3 hdc**, **1 sc**, **1 slst** along the chain. Cut off the extra yarn, secure it and then sew the leaf to the bottom of the stem.

Stick the bare end of the wire into the flower pot and secure with a few sewing stitches between the stem and the earth. Hide the threads inside.

The duck: (in Green, Beige, Ivory and Yellow yarn)

Start with the head: (in Green)

1	6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc (x6)	(12)
3	1 sc, inc (x6)	(18)
4-6	18 sc around, 3 rounds	(18)
7	6 sc, 6 inc, 6 sc	(24)
8	2 sc, dec (x6)	(18)
9	1 sc, dec (x6)	(12)
10	dec (x6)	(6)



Cut off the extra yarn and sew the opening with a needle by going through the front loops. Tighten and hide the yarn inside.

The beak: (in yellow yarn)

1	4 sc in a magic ring	(4)
2	1 sc, inc (x2)	(6)

End the round with 1 slst and keep some yarn to sew the beak onto the head. Sew the beak on round 7, in the middle of the increase. Secure and weave in ends.

Embroider the eyes on each side of the beak with black yarn.

The body: (in Beige and Ivory yarn)

1	6 sc in a magic ring	(6)
2	inc <i>(x6)</i>	(12)
3	1 sc, inc <i>(x6)</i>	(18)
4	2 sc, inc (x6)	(24)
5	(1 sc, inc) x3, 12 sc, (1 sc, inc) x3	(30)
6-7	30 sc around, 2 rounds	(30)
8	3 dec, 18 sc, 3 dec	(24)
9	1 dec, 9 sc,1 dec, 9 sc, 1 dec	(21)
10	5 sc, dec <i>(x3)</i>	(18)
11	Change for the lvory color during the last yarn over 1 sc, dec (x6)	(12)
12	12 slst around	(12)





Stuff the body.

Keep some yarn to sew the body under the head by going through the back loops of round 12. Secure and weave in ends.

The wings: (in Beige yarn)

Make a chain of **6 ch**. Crochet along the chain, starting in the 2nd ch after the hook : **1 sc**, **3 hdc**, **1 sc**

Sew the wings onto each side of the body. Secure and weave in ends.
